### Witch Killing

#### No Murder

VIENNA, July 24. (British United Press)—Faith in witchcraft still survives in the heart of Europe. This fact is manifest from an astonishing episode—with a judicial sequel—which has just occurred in Hungary and which shows what power superstition can still exercise over the Magyar mind.

An old woman had been beaten to death by members of a family who believed that one of their number was held in the thrall of a spell.

Farmer Pittlik fell ill of a mysterious malady, the nature of which baffled the village doctor. The patient began by losing his strength, then his speech, and finally his wits. The family were non-plussed until, in a lucid moment, the inspiration came to Pittlik that he must be bewitched. He prophesied in a frenzy that at a given hour the witch who had cast a spell over him would appear in his sick room, strangely enough, at the exact moment an old hag knocked at the door and hobbled into the room. "Stand back!" shouted all the family together, but the stranger approached.

At this moment, Michael Gal, Pittlik's brother-in-law sprang upon the old woman and threw her to the ground, whereupon all the others at tacked her with sticks, finally killing her, the victim made no sound, for she was deaf and dumb.

When she was dead, Pittlik sprang out of bed completely cured, or so the story goes, finding his speech to rejoice over the dead body of the sorceress.

The murdered woman's assailants were arrested and sentenced to long terms of imprisonment, but the Supreme Court ordered a new trial, as a result of which the sentences were reduced to three months' hard labor.

The Supreme Court ruled that the farmer and his family were justified in their assumption that the old woman was a witch, and that the only mistake they made was in killing her.

### HEBRON SCHOOL EXAMINATION

A very successful examination was held in Hebron school on the afternoon of June 27th. The pupils were examined by their teacher, Miss Eileen Morrissey assisted by Miss Sophia Clements, R. N. a former teacher and showed by their prompt and ready answers that they had been carefully instructed in their work.

### RESTRICTIONS ON IMMIGRATION

OTTAWA, July 24.—The crop situation in Canada will have a salutary effect on immigration it is believed in the capital. The foresightedness in limiting continental immigration and shutting it off on May 31 is considered as having prevented a more serious situation in the west and relieved to some extent the inevitable burden of unemployment which follows a poor crop year.

Mr. Forke is now in Western Canada with W. J. Egan, his deputy and it would not cause surprise here to find that still further restrictions will be placed on continental immigration and that even British Immigration may be pared down.

At present any Britisher can come to Canada at the low rate of \$50. The nominal rate is \$90, the balance being made up by the British and Canadian Governments. With poor crops in the west and less employment, the government will guard against an undue influx which may swell the unemployed. Farmers cannot carry hired hands through the winter when the crop has been poor, and cities have enough unemployed with those already here.

There is even a suggestion that some of the immigration expenditure may be diverted to assist the farmers, should conditions develop along the down road as at present. The land settlement board, formerly the soldier settlement board, may be called upon to keep track of the farmers in the various stricken districts and render such aid as may be possible.
