HARRIMAN'S WIDOW WILL MANAGE HER \$100,000,000.

NEW YORK, Nov 1.—Mrs. Mary Averil Harriman, widow of Edward Henry Harriman and sole legatee of his estate, which makes her one of the wealthiest women in the world, will take charge and personally direct the management of this great fortune of more than \$100,000,000, and possibly twice that amount. While Judge Robert S. Lovett may represent her in the boards of the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific railroads, and he or some other man may represent her in the directorates of the other great corporations in which Mr Harriman was interested, it will be this woman, sitting in her Fifth avenue office, who will direct the destinies of these great properties and who will give the final decision on all disputed questions that may arise.

Mrs. Harriman has leased offices at No. 457 Fth avenue, between Fortieth and Forty-first streets, the first floor of which is occupied by the uptown branch of the Farmers' Loan & Trust Company, and which is directly opposite the new public library. Her office will occupy the greater part of the second floor.

She is the largest individual stockholder in the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific railroads, the Wells-Fargo Express Company, and a large stockholder in many other corporations. While the details of the management of these properties will be left to others, it will be Mrs. Harriman at one end of the telephone who will give orders on important matters.

OTTAWA, Oct 31.—The first step taken in connection with the replacing of the Quebec bridge was in the action of the Government recently in calling for tenders for the removing of the debris from the south shore.

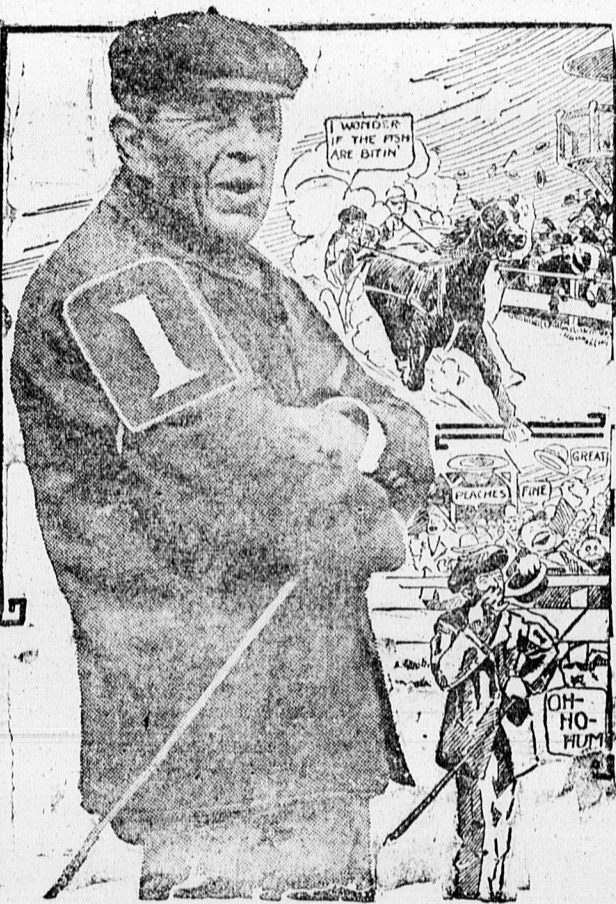
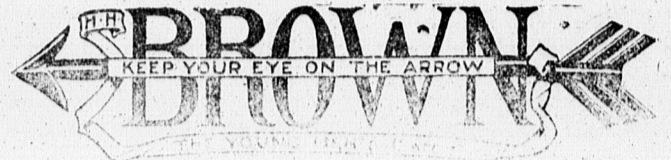

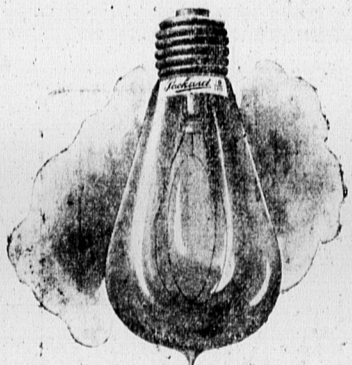
