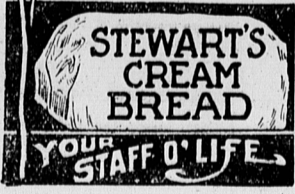

DRESDEN, July 24.—Ringling church bells is the occupation of a girl student in one of the German universities has adopted as a means of piecing out her inadequate income. She also did factory work and mending until a gift from the students of Nassau College provided her with money enough to buy meal tickets for the students' mess. Now she is able to devote more time to her studies. The students, messes give two hot meals a day at a cost in American money of two cents, but many of the woman students cannot afford even this small sum.

Many girls are trying to live on only one hot meal a day, and consequently the number forced to leave the universities and high schools because of illness is very large. Even the two hot meals provide adequate nourishment. They contain no meat or fats of any sort, and are chiefly boiled vegetables and cereals.

CASE DISMISSED—At the Police Court yesterday morning the adjourned case of Officer Walker vs. Wm. Power was dismissed. Several witnesses were examined.

Who gave evidence Monday being recalled, C. Gavan Duffy, K. C., who appeared for the defendant in addressing the court on behalf of his client stated this was one of the most brutal cases of assault that had ever been before the court. There was no evidence to show the defendant was drunk.

ments, they were in for a keen disappointment. More than two years have elapsed since those promises were made, but the shops that were to be enlarged still retain their pre-election dimensions, and P. E. Island-built cars have not yet graced the rails. Moreover, the staffs of the shops and the freight sheds have been still further reduced. And what was worse than all that: Right in the middle of last winter one of the most severe winters we have ever experienced all of the freight staff with the exception of the men in the office and one or two men in the sheds, were laid off for a month at a time, without pay.

That was the first time in the history of the railway that men on the permanent pay-roll were thus treated. It is needless to say that the entered idleness of the men was a severe hardship for their families and themselves, but it mattered not to the powers that be. "The need for economy" was given as the reason for it, but it was extremely difficult to reconcile this plea with what the Management was doing elsewhere: for while our idle freight men were spending with the problem of how to feed the hungry mouths, Sir Henry Thornton was demonstrating

ing how a big man could run a MILLION DOLLAR hotel in PARIS, and a ONE MILLION DOLLAR building in Toronto. And I may remark in passing that this latter building was offered for sale by its owner in the time when real estate was at peak prices for the consideration of less than \$750,000.

And the laying off of the permanent freight men was not the only innovation introduced on the Railway since the Liberals came into power. From the day the first spike was driven on the P. E. I. R. it has been the rule, when vacancies occurred at the head of the different branches of the service to fill the positions by promotion from the ranks. During the past year, however, the foremost positions in two of the leading branches of the service were filled by the importation of two men from other provinces, and thus the main incentive that men have for striving to give faithful and efficient service has been eliminated so far as local railway men are concerned.

It will thus be seen that the blessings that have come to railway men as a result of Liberal rule have been decidedly few, it is quite true of course that last week for election purposes the railway reverted to the forty-four-hour week but this order will on all probability be cancelled on the 27th of July or thereabouts and consigned to the Limbo of Pre-election sites, together with the "Sun Line" and the bridge over the Orwell river, and the "\$2,000 soldiers' bonus," etc., etc.
