OUR INDIAN WARDS.

There are something over a hundred thousand Indians in Canada—as many as the white population of our own little Province—the survivors of the so-called Indian nations who once were the sole human inhabitants of what is now Canada.

What of the future of these our Indian wards? They are gradually increasing in numbers under the fostering care of the Indian Department.

Rev. J. L. Strong of the Indian Reserve near Brantford, Ont., tells that three young Indian women are trained nurses, one is in the Government Civil Service at Ottawa, three or four are typewriters in offices, two men are doctors, another a civil engineer, one a dentist, four or five are clerks in offices, and two have taken up homesteads in the Northwest.

History has accustomed us to think of the Indian as a fierce fighter and a capable and courageous warrior. The names of Brant and Tecumseh figure in our early records. But we must not forget that the late Dr. Cronhyatekha, the exceedingly able chief of the I. O. Forsters, and Pauline Johnson, the charming poetess, were born on the same reserve where Brant held his war councils in the days of old.

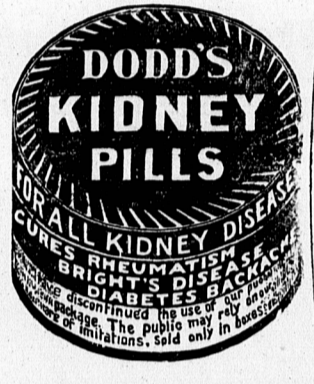
A MERRY RACE.
