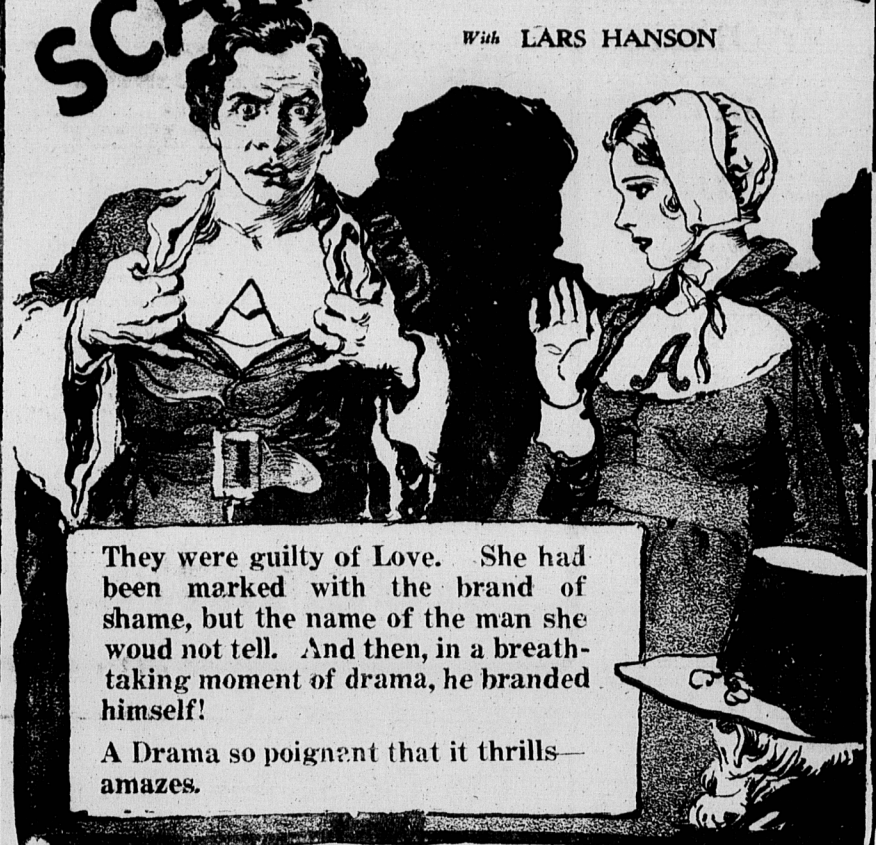

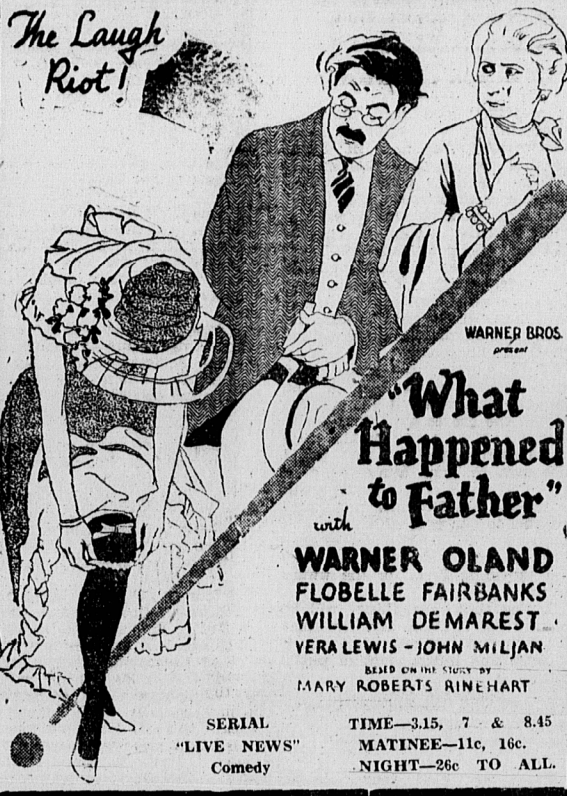

Maritime Hockeyists Will Play Under Many New Rules This Season

Although the Maritime Amateur Hockey Association has affiliated with the Canada Amateur Hockey Association, and will this season play under the rulings of the parent body, few hockey officials really know much about the C. A. H. A. rules. They should be closely studied by Maritime players, managers and officials.

(Partial List.)

1—Every player in the C. A. H. A. must hold an amateur card issued by the branches of the C. A. H. A. of Canada in which he plays.
2—All registration card duplicates are to be forwarded to the National Registrar within 15 days of receipt by Branch Registrar. February 10 is the final date for registration with the National Registrar.

3—All the branches of the C. A. H. A. must declare winners by March 5, senior and junior, to allow winners to engage in Allan Cup elimination.
4—In all cup finals, the best two out of three games shall decide the winner.
5—Defence area is defined as follows: On all rinks 200 feet or over in length a line is to be drawn 60 feet from the goal line on all smaller rinks the line is to be divided into three equal sections BETWEEN THE GOAL LINES. DISTANCE BEHIND GOAL POSTS must be at least 5 feet; ideal distance 10 feet. In the new 60-foot area the old rule applies, viz., no offence for DEFENDING TEAM. All rinks must be marked with defence lines as outlined above.

RESIDENCE RULE.

A—No player shall compete in an association match who has not a bona fide and continuous residence in the town, city or police village or rural district in which his club belongs since the 15th day of May preceding the date of said match. In case of a player residing in a rural district, village or police village, he must play for the C. A. H. A. Branch club nearest to his residence, having a team entered in the series in which he is eligible to play, it being understood that a junior player has the privilege of playing in the nearest place to his residence which has a Junior C. A. H. A. Branch team. The manner of determining the distance is to be computed by the nearest route over a well-established highway, and not as the crow flies. A bona fide and continuous residence shall include a teacher or student who may be absent from home and registered, and in actual and regular attendance at lectures at a preparatory school, high school, a university, or an affiliated college, providing he satisfies the C. A. H. A. through his C. A. H. A.

of an employee who has had six months' continuous service prior to this change of residence, and that player still continues in that same employment during the whole of the playing season. Players receiving certificates under this clause automatically forfeit them if they leave that service; or (2) In the case of boys (under 20 years of age on January 1st) the parents and family changes their residence and the boy continues to reside with his family. An amateur cannot sign a contract agreeing to take a professional position in athletics or to take part in any athletic sports (ice hockey). An amateur cannot receive any compensation for using the goods or apparatus of any firm, manufacturer or agent, nor shall he allow his name to be used as a means of advertising or recommending the goods of any manufacturer or firm. Any player who for a consideration, monetary or otherwise, binds himself directly or indirectly to play hockey with any particular club at any future date is automatically suspended until his case is dealt with in accordance with the regulations.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20. — Jake Schaefer, of Chicago, won the first block of his 1,500 points match with Walker Cochran, of Hollywood, for the world's 18.2 ball line billiard crown now held by the Californian. The score was 300 to 211.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20. — Phil Edwards, United States junior half mile champion, a native of the West Indies, and at present a student at New York University, will compete for Canada, in the coming Olympic games. It is announced by the Amateur Athletic Union.

The bout was featured by hard punching on the part of both boys.

SCHWARTZ IS READY

The New York State Boxing Commission which ordered Corporal Izzy Schwartz and "Newsboy" Brown to fight it out for the title last Friday when Schwartz won the decision, is not recognized by the National Boxing Association which governs the many art of self defence in all quarters of the globe with the exception of three states, New York, Pennsylvania and California. Izzy Schwartz, however, today wired the Canadian Press to the effect that he was willing to meet the winner of tonight's fight in an endeavor to clear up the situation in the flyweight division. What will happen now is problematical. It is believed that Schwartz and Belanger will now meet and decide the issue once and for all.

Henri Cochet Is Defeated

LYONS, France, Dec. 20. — Henri Cochet has suffered his first tennis defeat since he returned with the triumphant Davis Cup team from the United States last September. The latest French marvel, 17-year-old Georges Sotson, defeated him, 6-2, 8-10, 7-4. This was Cochet's first tournament in his home town since 1926. He now resides in Paris. Experts say Sotson's victory was no fluke. They point out that he reached the finals by defeating Donald M. Grigg, ranking English player, 6-1, 4-6, 6-1. "Too many receptions and too rich homecoming food," Cochet said, without apologizing for his defeat.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20. — Phil Bernstein, manager of Corporal Izzy Schwartz, recognized by the New York State Athletic Commission as the flyweight boxing champion of the world, today announced he would give the winner of tonight's bout at Toronto between "Frenchy" Belanger, Canadian champion, and Ernie Jarvis, European champion, the first opportunity to meet Schwartz in a bout that would settle the much-disputed championship of the flyweight division.

The Belanger-Jarvis bout tonight has been sanctioned by the National Boxing Commission as a championship affair. Schwartz won the world's title, in the view of the New York State authorities, by defeating "Newsboy" Brown last Friday night. Belanger holds a decision over Brown and Frankie Genaro, another contender for the title left vacant by Fidel Lebarba, who retired to attend University.
