GERMAN PLANS FOR ATTACK ON EGYPT

LONDON, Dec. 15.—The announcement that Dutch East India liners and mail boats will abandon for the present their usual course through the Suez Canal and will follow the Cape Route, in conjunction with the Cologne Gazette's report of British trench digging and general defensive preparations on both sides of the canal, is taken by the Rotterdam correspondent of the Daily News as confirmation of rapidly maturing German designs on Egypt.

The Dutch steamship companies explain the change of route by the increasing uncertainty of obtaining the necessary amount of coal at the appointed stations, but as the change of route will prolong the voyage for twelve or fourteen days, the Daily News correspondent asserts that the change could not have been dictated by any but the most serious reasons. From various other sources come hints of the rapid completion of German plans for a projected attack on Egypt.

BOY-ED AND VON PAPEN SCHEDULED TO LEAVE UNITED STATES TUESDAY

NEW YORK, Dec. 15.—Captains Boy-Ed and Von Papen will leave New York, barring a change in their plans, on Tuesday next, on the Holland-American liner Noordam. This was learned authoritatively to-day, although officials of the line declined to discuss the matter.

BULGARIANS STOP AT GREEK FRONTIER

BERLIN, Dec. 17.—(By wireless to Sayville)—The official report of the Bulgarian headquarters staff dated December 15, as received here to-day, the Overseas News Agency announces, is as follows:

Bulgarian troops have temporarily stopped at the Greek frontier, their pursuit of the enemy.

The Bulgarians took as prisoners, 1,234 soldiers, among whom were 18 officers. They also captured 14 cannon, 62 ammunition cars and much war material.
