REFUSES APPEAL.—A private despatch was received from Ottawa, Thursday, announcing that the Supreme Court of Canada had refused the defendant leave to appeal in the case of the Royal Bank of Canada against the Estate of Sa. ley Wedlock Limited, in Bankruptcy. This was a claim of \$25,000 of the Royal Bank against the Wedlock Estate which the Trustee in Bankruptcy refused to allow. An appeal was taken out in the Bankruptcy Court before the Chief Justice who allowed the Bank's claim and the decision was sustained on appeal by the full court of the Province. The trustee of the Estate applied to the Supreme Court of Canada for leave to appeal from this decision of our Supreme Court, which leave has been refused.
