At the Police Court yesterday Angus and Alfred Chapman for assault occasioning actual bodily harm on Edgar McCarron early last Sunday morning, were each given six months imprisonment in Queen's County jail. A. J. B. Mellich represented the defendants.

The Moderator and Clerk of the British Columbia Synod are both Maritime Province men. Rev. J. M. McLeod, formerly of Charlottetown, P. E. I. is Moderator; Rev. J. A. Logan, former pastor of Acadia Mines, is Clerk and also Convener of Committee on Sabbath Schools.

TODAY promises to be a gala day throughout the province. Among the notable gatherings that are to take place are: the Whelan Demonstration at the C. A. A. grounds; the unveiling of the monument to the pioneers at Brudenelle Island; the Zion Church picnic at Hunter River; the St. James Church picnic at Westville and Baptist picnic at Hazelbrook.

A REPRESENTATIVE meeting of the inhabitants of Hunter River, Hazel Grove, Clyde Station, Junction Road, Springton, Hartsville and Lot 30 was held in Hartsville Hall on Tuesday evening last to consider the advisability of preparing a monster petition for the release of Malcolm McLeod now confined in Queen's County jail on a charge of assaulting Alexander Buchanan. A unanimous resolution was passed embodying the above idea and a committee appointed to carry the resolution into effect. A number of those present volunteered to assist in reaping his crop and taking care of his farm during his imprisonment.

A DISPUTE between the contractors of the new market house and the sub-contractor of the cellar digging, yesterday forenoon as to the grading for the foundation caused a cessation of work for a short time. The matter of controversy was amicably settled however and in the afternoon the work proceeded. The trouble originated from the subcontractors Michael McCarthy and Thomas Sweeney who previously had been selling the clay, objecting to place it at the rear of the cellar for grading. This they refused to do, so T. A. McLean, jr., closed the gates and yesterday afternoon had a new gang of men on the work.

YESTERDAY was St. Swithun's Day and the proverb "if it rains on St. Swithun's Day there will be rain for forty days" gives gloomy prospects for time to come. The legend is that St. Swithun, Bishop of Winchester who died in 862 desired to be buried in the church yard of the minister that the "sweet rain of heaven might fall upon his grave." At canonization the monks thought to honor the saint by removing his body into the choir and fixed July 15 for the ceremony; but it rained day after day for forty days, so that the monks say the saints were adverse to their project and wisely abandoned it.

THE Souris tea yesterday was one of the most largely attended ever held in Kings County. The excursion from the Madgalen Islands brought about 50 excursioners, and over 30 more from Plover. The special that left here in the morning with nine cars was crowded when it reached Mount Stewart and all passengers from Mount Stewart and intermediate stations to Souris were compelled to walk for the regular. The day was thoroughly enjoyed by all and went off most successfully both financially and otherwise. The thunder storm that passed over here in the afternoon was not visible in the east, the day in Souris being most perfect. The committee in charge are to be congratulated for their exceedingly good management. The special returned at 11 o'clock.

THE funeral of the late John Archibald MacDonald, Glenside, which took place yesterday from his late residence to Bonaventure's church, was largely attended. A solemn requiem high mass was sung by the Rev. P. D. McGuigan for the repose of his soul, after which his remains were quietly laid to rest in the adjoining cemetery. The pall bearers were Messrs H. J. Cundall, G. D. Rankin, F. P. Carvell, Horace Hazard, A. C. MacKinnon and Stephen MacDonald.

Stinson Jarvis, of New York, who writes weekly yachting letters to the Winnipeg Free Press, and who has been watching the yachts closely and comparing their performances, says there is nothing to fear as to windward work of Shamrock III, while as to running there is positive proof that the Reliance is not in the same class with the challenger. Even the American writers are commenting on the small difference between Columbia and Reliance, saying that Hoff has shown little improvement since 1880. I say that he has shown none. Reliance has to give a huge time allowance, somewhere between three and five minutes, and in many of these races it is a question as to whether she wins the true time allowance on measurement being conceded by the New York Yacht Club, but it is apparently admitted by newspapers to have three minutes to Columbia, and very much the same allowance will go to Shamrock III. The prospects for an English challenger were never so rosy as at present. Bar accidents and accepting the lines of proof and the time allowance it's a cinch.

THIRTEEN members of the Trappist Monastery at Thymasno, Little Brittany, France, are now at Tracadie, Antigonish, in the Monastery at that settlement. Should the French Government determine on the expulsion of the Trappist order from the country, fifty more members join those already at Tracadie. The present contingent includes three priests and four choir brothers. The Prior is Father Eugene. He expresses himself as pleased with his new home, and hopes the re-establishment of his order will prove beneficial to the community. The present number are chiefly elderly men, and each has practical knowledge of a useful trade, one being an expert machinist. They will institute a model farm, saw and grist mills, carpenter, blacksmith and other industrial shops, and will also impart instruction in advanced farming. The people of Tracadie and vicinity, who were greatly inconvenienced by the removal of the former body of monks and the consequent cessation of work at their grist mill and workshop, are delighted at the prospect of the re-opening of these advantages.
