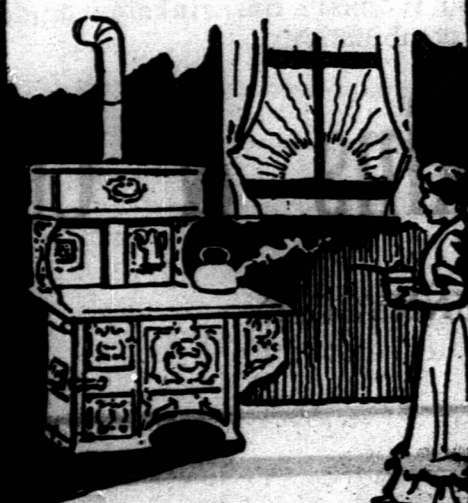

HOW THE STATES STAND IN THE NEWLY ELECTED HOUSE.

Returns From Forty-Five States Show a Republican Majority of Twenty-Five—Some Few Districts Yet in Doubt But Cannot Materially Affect the General Result.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5.—The latest returns received up to 10 o'clock tonight show that the Republicans (including the Fusionists elected from the Pittsburgh Allegheny district in Pennsylvania) will control the next house by a vote of 204 Republicans to 179 Democrats with one district, the Eighth Tennessee and the California districts remaining so much in doubt that the official returns will be needed to decide the result. The totals given are believed to be correct.

Although there are a few districts, such as two in Colorado and one in Minnesota where the Republican and Democratic party managers respectively do not concede defeat, but the general result could not be affected even should their claims prove well founded. The table by states is as follows:

LESSON HELPS.

14. "Now therefore"—This is the second address of Joshua and is more solemn than the first, which is recorded in the preceding chapter. Both must have been delivered near the close of his life. "In sincerity and in truth"—Not in the outward form which is commanded in the law alone, but with your whole soul engaged in worship. "Put away the gods"—Joshua saw the strong tendencies towards idolatry, and could not fail to foresee that this was to be their great sin. "Other side of the flood"—Before their crossing Jordan; it includes all the idols that were set up by their fathers, the gods of Chaldeans, the Egyptians, the Moabites, and the Canaanites. How easy it is for them to fall into idolatry is seen in the variety of gods which they worshipped.

15. "Seem evil"—If it does not seem right for you to worship God, or if it seems against your interests, "Choose you"—All real religious worship and service must be a free and voluntary act.

"This day"—Choice must be immediate to be effective. To wait till the calamity of your disobedience falls upon you is to wait until it is too late. God is not mocked. "For me and my house"—His decision implies not only his choice, but his purpose also to set before them a proper example.

16. G. d. forbid"—That they were sincere in their covenant is seen from the fact that they did serve the Lord all the days of Joshua, and of the elders who outlived him. See verse 31.

17. "Brought us up"—Their covenant had a powerful incentive in the miraculous manner in which they had been brought to their present position.

19. "Ye cannot serve the Lord"—This is a part of a condition, the other member of which is found in the whole passage under review, and it is equivalent to saying, ye cannot serve God unless you put away the gods of the nations about you. "Jealous God"—His affection is to be seen even in his judgments; he will not have his people defiled.

20. "Consume you"—The choice is not only between the ways of living, but between the consequence of those ways.

21. "Nay; we will"—The earnestness with which Joshua places the choice before the people makes their insistence upon their purpose the stronger.

22. "Witnesses"—You know the dangers of falling from this covenant, and you are witnesses of this compact you make and the conditions under which you make it.

23. "Made a covenant"—Literally, "cut the covenant," alluding to the sacrifices which was offered on the occasion.

"Statute and ordinance"—Reducing the covenant to a statute, and an act signed and witnessed by both Joshua and the people. "Shechem"—The scene of a former covenant.
