BERLIN, March 30—Considerable astonishment is manifested by German naval officials over the willingness of President Roosevelt and other

American naval experts to permit Eyan's fleet to encircle the globe without a long period of rest. The opinion is expressed that many of the vessels will be practically "useless" when they return to American waters after such unprecedentedly strenuous exertions.

DEBENTURES WERE SOLD AT 98.025

And Montrealers Seem To Think That was Pretty Good Selling.

MONTREAL, March 30.—That the money market is improving is shown today when the tenders were opened for \$1,000,000 of the city of Montreal forty years debentures bearing four per cent. interest. Five bids were received for the whole amount, the highest being that of the Bank of Montreal at 97.025. While the civic officials were hopeful of receiving 98 they are still satisfied, for the price offered is better than that at which the last New York loan was floated being equal, on a four and a half per cent. basis, to 106.80, as compared with the 104 which the New York bonds brought. Brown Bros. of New York were among the bidders for the whole amount.

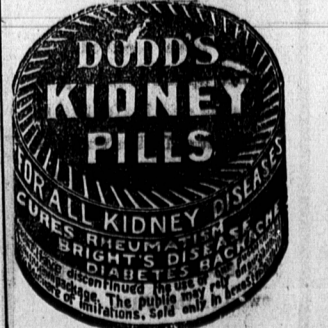
