Sleeping Malady Serum Indicated

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—Discovery in the blood of St. Louis sleeping sickness convalescents of substances which protect mice against the disease was announced tonight in "Science" by the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research.

The announcement adds evidence for a hope generally expressed by medical men that in the serum of human beings or of animals having sleeping sickness, there will be found ultimately one of the immunizing agents useful for protection against encephalitis.

The Institute studies have not advanced to the point of testing this serum on human beings. The immunizing agent was detected during extensive experiments of much greater scientific interest, which are also announced tonight.

These appear to disclose the active cause of the disease. They are described by Leslie T. Webster and George L. Fite. These workers inoculated the brains of special strains of mice susceptible to encephalitis, with brain tissue taken last Summer from fatal cases of sleeping sickness both in St. Louis and Kansas City.

The mice mostly developed sleeping sickness. From these mice, brain tissues were removed and in turn given to fresh mice. This was repeated 15 times. At the end of the 15th transfer, the infection in the mouse brain was uniformly causing sleeping sickness.

The experiments indicated pointedly that the cause of the disease is a virus, which cannot be seen under a microscope nor caught in the finest filter.

Especially significant is the fact that when this infected mouse brain was instilled into the noses of other mice, they developed virtually 100 per cent fatal signs of sleeping sickness.

AUDIENCE ASTOUNDED

NEW YORK, November 19.—An eight-year-old pianist—so small that her feet were barely able to reach the pedals and her hands to stretch an octave—astounded an audience at a recital in Town Hall tonight.

Holding her audience through a long programme of difficult compositions, Ruth Slenczynski, of Berkeley, Calif., received a thunderous ovation and was forced to respond to more than a half dozen encores.

It was her first appearance in New York, and, except for a concert in San Francisco three years ago, was in the nature of an American debut. At her San Francisco concert a fund was raised to send her to Europe for further study. She has given recitals in Berlin and Paris.

Ruth, so much a child that keeping her dainty white dress from wrinkling was an absorbing interest before each piece, played a programme that no concert pianist, however mature, need have been ashamed of. It included the Bach prelude in E major.

AIR TAXI IN RECORD FLIGHT
Captain Crawford Greene, of Worcester, England, is taking the longest air-taxi flight ever made, from Worcester to Australia. His 6,000 mile trip in a chartered plane will end in his native land, for he is the only Australian-born member of the British House of Commons.
