-GRAND MEETING.—The second of a series of monthly social and temperance entertainments was held in the town hall, Alberton, on Wednesday evening last. While the attendance could not be deemed the endorsement of the citizens and others expressed by the unusually large number of people who crowded the hall on this latter occasion, augurs well for the success of future endeavors. Intimation having been given that the entertainment would assume the form of a lecture on temperance and moral reform, illustrated by lantern slides, by Rev. H. R. Stavert, M. W., Chap. National Division, Sons of Temperance, and Grand Lecturer and Organizer of P. G. W. D. Grand Division, Sons of Temperance of New Brunswick, an expectant audience listened with rapt attention to a forceful and exhaustive lecture on the burning question of temperance reform, as previously reported. With the use of slides illustrative of the effects of alcohol on the human system as also of the poverty misery and ruin following in the wake of intemperance, the lecturer impressed many startling facts on his audience. Then followed an address lasting one hour the equal of which has seldom if ever been delivered to a provincial audience. In moving a vote of thanks to Mr. Stavert, the veteran prohibitionist Lieut. Governor Rogers, stated that in all his experience he had never listened to such an exhaustive and clear presentation of the subject. John Agnew complimented the lecturer on his fearless enunciation of the truth regarding the great problem and a standing vote of thanks went to a really hearty vote of thanks which was tendered the lecturer by the chairman Rev. J. A. Winfield, whose endorsement was expressed in a bright and fitting speech. The vote of thanks was duly acknowledged after which the singing of the National Anthem brought to a close one of the most educative and inspiring public temperance meetings ever held in Alberton. May the growing temperance sentiment recently reawakened, and greatly encouraged by the several pastors and strengthened by Wednesday evening's lecture, ere long result in concerted action on the part of the citizens of Alberton against this existing evil,—for sentiment is a poor weapon indeed with which to cope with law-breakers.—Com.
