**AT THE ALBERTON POLICE COURT.**—A few days ago, before Stipendiary Tanton, five persons, charged with an infraction of the Game Laws, were convicted and fined the minimum sum of \$10, each and costs. This law reads that "no person shall offer for sale or expose for sale or cause to be sold or to buy any wild game in or out of the close season," etc. A meat dealer at that place, had placed in his window for sale a quantity of wild ducks, which the game warden had confiscated and for safety had the same secured and locked up in the Court house building during the law proceedings, some persons gained entrance to the building and carried off all the ducks. The guilty parties, who are still at large, are being eagerly sought for by the authorities.

**Irish Peace Delegates In London**

LONDON, Oct. 9.—The Irish peace delegates spent a quiet Sunday in London, the delegates and the secretaries dividing their time between the various churches.

A third secretary has been added to the delegation. He is John Chartres, and his appointment has provoked much speculation. His name is unknown in Irish politics and he is the only one connected with the delegation who is not a member of the Dail Eireann and any other representative body. He is the grandson of Richard Chartres of Dublin, his father being the late Sergeant Major Chartres of the Eighth Hussars. He married the Italian poetess, Annie Vivanti.

His accession to the Irish delegation is taken as indicating that the Sinn Fein is engaging all expert advice possible, as Mr. Chartres is an expert in several branches of law and has served in the intelligence section of the British War Office.

Others invited to assist the delegation, although not Sinn Feiners, are Dr. George O'Brien, historian and economist, and George Russell, of the Irish Homestead, and a former official of the British local government board, to handle the intricate questions of local government.

The chief risk to a settlement now is believed to be in Ireland, rather than in the conference chamber. Both sides allege that breaches of the truce have recently multiplied. Dublin Castle claims to have a list of 600 such breaches, while Sinn Fein liaison officers have issued numerous instances of alleged aggression by police, auxiliaries and soldiers.

To carry arms is a breach of the truce, but to drill troops is not; neither is the transfer of troops and each side has answered the other's complaint by saying that they were only training or moving troops.

**Serious Accident Near Newcastle**

NEWCASTLE, N. B., Oct. 9.—A serious accident, as the result of a collision between an automobile and a carriage, occurred near Newcastle this afternoon. An automobile owned by Isaac Mitchell, merchant, of Newcastle, and driven by one of his sons, was on the way to Newcastle when it met a carriage occupied by Sylvester White and his wife on the woods bridge near Barehill Mills. A collision occurred and the horse was thrown over the bridge. The people alighted on logs ten or fifteen feet high and were badly injured. They were taken to the hospital and their condition is reported serious. The full extent of their injuries could not be ascertained tonight. The horse was badly cut.

**Shot Dead in New Brunswick**

NEWCASTLE, N. B., Oct. 9.—Word was received here yesterday afternoon of a sad and tragic hunting fatality which occurred Friday evening at Carleton, on the southwest Miramichi, about twenty miles from Newcastle. The victim of the tragic affair was Archie McLean, of Black River, who was one of a hunting party, composed of five young men and five young women. The party were hunting at Carleton and towards evening had wounded a deer. They started in pursuit of the wounded animal and young McLean, it is stated, went farther into the woods than the others thought he had. One of the party catching sight of the young man in the growing darkness and thinking it was the deer, fired at him with deadly effect. The bullet hit the unfortunate young man in a vital part and he only lived a short time. Which one of the party fired the fatal shot has not yet been ascertained.

Included in the party were a brother, sister and a cousin of the victim of the tragic event.

Young McLean was between 20 and 24 years of age. The body was conveyed to the deceased's home at Black River Saturday afternoon. Members of the party are terribly grieved over the shocking affair.
