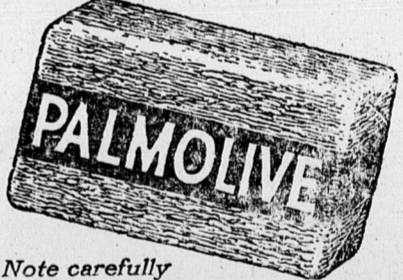

SIR HENRY HERE TALKS BUS LINES

TORONTO, Aug. 31.—Sir Henry Thornton surprised local C. N. R. officers by dropping into their midst after advising them Monday he would not come. He is, however, in the midst of them, discussing the establishing of motor and bus lines in connection with the steam railway train service. Speaking of the subject under discussion, Sir Henry said: "Competition is keen from that source and we are giving it considerable consideration."

"How did you find things in the west?" "They are in excellent shape and there is a very healthy spirit among the people. They have a very confident opinion about their future. The crop is excellent out there. They call it a bumper one and it will yield them about \$100,000 more than last year."

When asked about the talked-of merging of the two big corporations, he said: "Our policy is to co-operate with a view to reducing expenses."

SCIENTIST BREAKS OUT INTO VERSE

SOUTHAMPTON, England, Aug. 31.—Modern scientists are not dull, prosy fellows without a spark of poetry or imagination. Prof. W. A. Parkes, of Toronto, Canada one of the delegates attending the annual meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, proved this today by bursting into verse in the course of a lecture in which he was telling his hearers that earthquakes were not an unmitigated evil. Here is the principal stanza in his verse into versification.

What is it that rules the upper crust? Isostasy, isostasy, What actuates the over-thrust? Isostasy, isostasy, What gives the shore lines wanderlust, What tumbles highlands into dust, What makes the strongest stratum bust? Isostasy, isostasy.

It might be explained that isostasy is the theory of general equilibrium in the earth's crust, supposed to be maintained by the yielding or flow of rock material beneath the surface under the stress of gravitation. Prof. Parkes remarked that earthquakes showed the surface of the earth was not uniformly rigid and that if it were it would bring on geologically speaking, the universal deluge and "the end of the present order of things."

Notes on the P. E. Island Egg Laying Contest, for the 43 Week Ending August 28th, 1925

The Contest during the past week with 49 eggs. Mr. G. F. Connor's birds are broody. The number of eggs laid for the week was 173. The total number of eggs laid to date 30594. This is 1576 eggs more than was laid at the same date last year.

Mr. Sam McPherson's White Leghorns lead the Contest for the week with 49 eggs. Mr. G. F. Connor's White Leghorns were second with 46 eggs. Mr. Edward Bullpitt's pen of White Leghorns No. 3, were third with 41 eggs. Mrs. F. Halliday's Barred Rocks were fourth with 40 eggs. Mr. W. G. Macdonald's Barred Rocks were fifth with 39 eggs. Mr. H. M. Hyde's Barred Rocks tied with Mr. Joseph Carmichael's Barred Rocks for sixth place with 37 eggs each.

Mr. A. Wisner's White Wyandottes were seventh with 36 eggs. Mr. J. Spurgeon Jenkin's Barred Rocks tied with the Experimental Station's pen of White Leghorns for eighth place with 35 eggs each.

Mr. Sam McPherson's pen of White Leghorns leads the Contest by one egg, with a total of 1859 eggs. Mr. G. F. Connor's White Leghorns, which had to give up first place this week, are following close in second place with 1853 eggs. Mr. Joseph Carmichael's Barred Rocks are third with 1779. Mr. Walter Buntain's Barred Rocks are fourth with 1733. Mr. Edward Bullpitt's White Leghorns, pen No. 3 are fifth with 1689. Mrs. Fred MacIntyre's White Leghorns are sixth with 1660. Mr. W. G. Macdonald's Barred Rocks are seventh with 1623. Mr. A. Wisner's White Wyandottes are eighth with 1595. Mr. Charles Mackenna's Barred

Rocks are ninth with 1588. Mr. Everett Howatt's White Leghorns are tenth with 1562.
