Features New York Stock Market

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (AP)—The stock market rallied briskly at the start of today's proceedings after six declining sessions.  
The Associated Press 60-stock composite regained a point at 60.4 of its drop of 1.9 in the preceding session.  
Canadian stocks went up with the reviving market. Both Hiram Walker and Distillers Seagram advanced a point, McIntyre 1-2, Dome Mines 3-8 and Canadian Pacific 1-4. On the curb, Lake Shore was unchanged.  
Among favorites, Union Pacific added 6 1-4 points at 117, Oudahy 4 at 39 1-2, Youngstown Sheet 3 at 62, Montgomery Ward 1-4 at 48 3-8, Johns-Manville 3 at 122, U. S. Rubber 2 7-8 at 55 1-2, U. S. Steel 2 at 68, Gimbel 2 7-8 at 39 7-8 (on record sales and earnings) Atlantic Coast Line 2 1-2 at 49 and Chrysler 2 3-4 at 82 1-8.  
In front were Bethlehem, Republic Steel, Santa Fe, Pennsylvania Railroad, Southern Pacific, Baltimore and Ohio, Southern Railway, Goodyear, Goodrich, Electric Power and Light, Air Reduction, Armour Wilson and Co., Standard Oil (N.J.), Du Pont, Union Carbide and National Container (on a lifted dividend).  
General Motors broke 50 after holding at this figure through Wednesday's release but came back to finish up 1-8 at 90 1-8; losers included American Telephone, American Tobacco "B" and Texas Co.

**Prices Stiffen After**

Early Downward Trend

MONTREAL, Oct. 10 (CP)—Prices stiffened in spots after trends were generally downward in early trading today on the stock exchange and curb market. Leading papers reversed their tendencies in particular. However, losses at the bell were still well ahead of gains and in the indices Utilities, Industrials, Banks and Golds were lower and papers up.  
Converting decreases into increases in papers were Price, Fraser, Consolidated, Abithli Preferred, Donnacoma, International M and O, in the balance of the group, Edley was higher and other Abithli Common, Brown Preferred, Bathurst and Dryden, Brown Common recovered from a stumble.  
Switching from the loss to win territory in industrials were Doco, whose employees have been called back to work after the recent steel strike, Dominion Bridge and International Bronze. Cement Common and Canadian Car Common deleted deficits. Always better were Dominion Coal Preferred, Oileath, Canadian Industries National Steel Car and Woollens. Weaker were Building Products, General Steel, Wares, Cyprium, Cockshutt, Vickers, Cement preferred, Hamilton Bridge, United Steel, Fleet, Canadian Locomotive, Massey and Ontario Steel, Dominion Textile and Celanese lost height in textiles. In beverages, in front were Seagram, which opened lower, Canadian Breweries, Walker, United Distillers, Molson and Sicks. Winnipeg Electric, down in industrial transfers, Shawinigan and Gatineau were winners in utilities and softer were Montreal Power, Bell, Brazilian, Montreal Tramways and B. C. Power. Commerce, Montreal and Royal recovered in banks. C.P.R. turned a loss into a rise in carriers.

Out On Strike

LONDON, Oct. 10 (CP)—Catering staffs at three of the world's most luxurious hotels walked out tonight in support of striking kitchen help at the swank Savoy Hotel and Simpson's Restaurant. One of the sympathy strikes at the Dorchester Hotel, lasted only 15 minutes. Dordchester cooks, who had walked out just as 500 persons were about to sit down for dinner, returned to their jobs after the manager said demands for union recognition would be referred to the hotel owners.  
The strikes began at breakfast time at the Savoy and Simpson's, and spread at dinner-time to Claridge's, the Berkeley and the Dorchester.

**H. M. S. Nootka Joins-Up**

After two months of intensive training, the new Canadian-built Tribal class destroyer, H. M. C. S. "Nootka" has joined the fleet. Since her commissioning on August 7, "Nootka" has carried out exercises off the coast of Nova Scotia with a view to making the ship's company completely familiar with the new ship and her armament.  
The above picture was taken as "Nootka" carried out full speed trials after her commissioning while dockyard workers were still on board checking machinery and equipment. The photograph shows the torrent of foam thrown up astern of the warship as her engines drive her at a speed of around 35 knots. The white ensign flutters crisply in the breeze created by the speeding ship.
