Father Croken assisted by Rev. Father McCaulay as deacon and Rev. Dr. McLellan as sub-deacon and Rev. I. R. A. McDonald, Master of Ceremonies. In the sanctuary also were Rev. D. J. G. McDonald, while the Rev. Theodore Gallant assisted in the choir. There was a number of floral tributes including wreaths from Lieutenant Governor McDonald, the Government of P. E. Island and Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Richardson. The pall bearers were Messrs G. Albert Aitkin, John W. McPhee, Capt. Hugh McPhee, Capt. William Gordon, Capt. Alex A. McDonald and Mr. Thomas E. Morrissey. The chief mourners were the sons of the deceased his brother, Lieutenant Governor McDonald and his nephew Judge Aeneas A. McDonald, and Judge McInerney, a son in law, St. John. Among those present were Chief Justice Mathieson, Hon. Murdoch McKinnon, Mr. J. D. Stewart, M. L. A., Major Bartlett and Mr. George J. Rogers. By an unfortunate mistake, quoted from the Parliamentary Guide, the Guardian stated yesterday that Mr. McDonald was twice married. This was not so. The lady whose name was given as his first wife was his mother. The name Maude, was also given in error for Marion as one of the daughters.

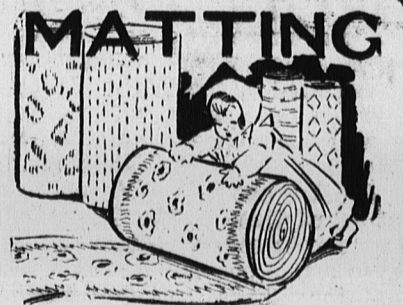

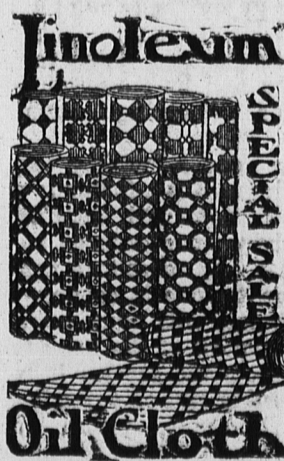
