PROGRESS OF THE WAR.

The tremendous struggle of the past ten days appears to have resulted in another victory for the Japanese arms. The scene of the struggle has been between the Taitse and Hun rivers which cross the railway from east to west forty miles apart, the first named stream near Liao Yang and the Hun a little south of Mukden.

In the first days of the recent fighting the advantage apparently rested with the Russians. They advanced and the Japanese retired. The advance covered some 25 miles from the Hun River almost to Yentai. Then the tide of battle turned and the Russians appear to have been forced back again to or beyond the Hun River, with enormous losses in men and many guns.
