and other dependants, a total of \$91,692 pensioners.

It must, of course be assumed that many of the pensioners are deserving, and that the rich Republic can well afford to contribute to their comfort in their advanced years.

Added to the billions which represented the first cost of the war to the United States Government, the billions more in property destroyed and the million of lives sacrificed in the struggle, is this vast sum of four thousand millions of dollars already paid in pensions.

Blake accepted a position without office in the cabinet, but in 1875 became Minister of Justice.

After the defeat of the Mackenzie Government he was chosen to lead the Opposition which position he held till after the general election of 1887 when he retired and was succeeded by Mr. Laurier.

Lord Rosebery spoke of Mr. Blake as "the most brilliant orator and one of the most capable statesmen of Canada."

APPEALS TO THE PRIVY COUNCIL.

The Ottawa Journal has become convinced, for reasons which it gives, that the right of appeal from the Canadian courts to the Privy Council in England is of very doubtful advantage to the Dominion, and in support of its opinion cites three Canadian cases which the court of last resort decided. We quote:

"In all these cases it was a question of vested right against the public weal. One suit was that of Toronto city against the Toronto Street Railway Company, in which the apparently plain intent and plain English of the Street Railway contract there to give to the city authorities certain rights was upset by the Privy Council after the city had won in Canadian courts.

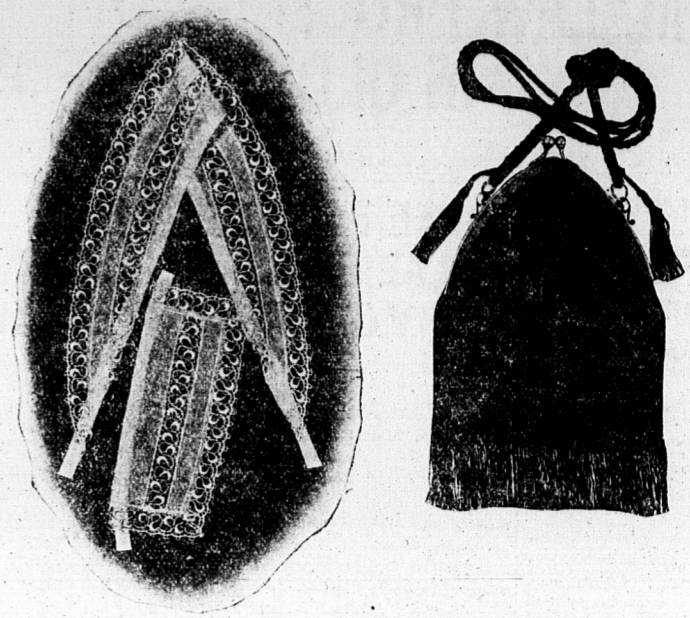
AUTOMOBILING IN P. E. I.
