MT. STEWART FACTORY.—The cheese factory at Mount Stewart which has been running for the last two months is under the skilful management of Mr. Alexander L. McDonald. The residents regret to see so few patrons sending milk in from such a large country, but hope that there is brighter days in store for it in the near future.—S.

SUMMER RESORTS.—The company owning the summer cottages and the large dining hall at Holland Cove, have done good business here the summer season. The six cottages that they erected this spring were all fully occupied from the beginning of the summer, about thirty persons being the total number that inhabited them, while Holland Hall was always largely patronized by visitors from the city and other parts of the Island, especially on Saturdays, when a visit to the Hall and participation in the excellent meals served there was the usual program of the outing to Rocky Point. On Saturday last, for example, there were thirty sitting down to table at one time. The resorts will be closed for the season after today. Upon the success of this season's undertaking the company will enlarge their accommodation for next summer, when it is the intention also to keep the resort open for at least a fortnight later than is being done now. There are six cottages at the Cove now, besides Holland Hall, and it is proposed to build at least six more for next summer. Work is to be commenced immediately on the foundations of the new cottagers.

The visiting team is understood to be a strong combination, while the local club has certainly got together as good a team as could be picked from its ranks. This, therefore, ensures a keen and interesting game, and it is only to be hoped that the weather gods will be kind and favor the occasion with nice bright sunshine.

GOLF CUP.—This is the fifth year the Inter-Provincial Cup of the Ladies Maritime Golf Association has been played for. The trophy came into existence in 1909, when the Nova Scotia team registered the first victory. Nova Scotia retained possession of the trophy in 1910 and won again in 1911. But in 1912 a period was put to the winning streak of the Nova Scotians. The New Brunswick and P. E. Island team won it that year. The period, however, proved to be only temporary, as this year, at the tournament just concluded at the Belvidere Links, Charlottetown, Nova Scotia scored again, making it their fourth victory of the five occasions on which the cup has been played for up to the present. Their win on this occasion was quite decisive, their score being 30 to 40 by the N. B. and P. E. I. team. The cup is a handsome trophy of solid silver.

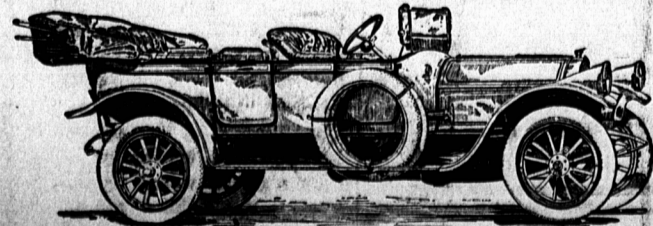
