Race Record 2.18 1-4

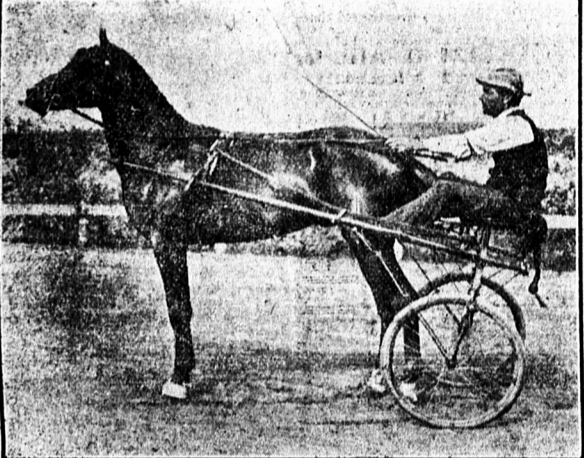
Holder of the Provincial race record for Stallions in 1904, 1905, and 1907 Banito to a horse of magnificent proportions, strong at every point, deep through the heart a good back, strong, long, wonderfully strong quarters, smooth clean limbs with the best of feet. He is a beautiful bay color, stands 13 1/2 hands, weighs 1100 lbs. and is a horse of grand courage and style, altogether a model of strong masculine beauty and individuality with fine finish. As a race horse, there are few his equal in the Province. Banito's opportunities in the stud up to the present time have been limited, as he has been in training every season except for a short time in the spring. He sired 2 year olds last season. They are all of good size and the only two that were trained showed miles better than 2.20 on the trot.

The sire of Banito was Bunton Wilkes 708, sired by Kase 1201-4, Yorta 200 1-4 and 15 other in 2.30 list, he by the great sire and founder of the Wilkes family, Geo Wilkes 519, he by Hambleton 10.

Banito's dam is the great brood mare Boneta Jan of four in the 2.30 list including Aca Joshua 2103-4, Lulu D 2114-4, Banito 2191-4, Pallas 2181-4, she by Davernant 1906, oco dam, Donna dam of two in the 2.30 list.

Banito will make the season of 1908 at Central Stables, Queen St., Ch'town.

George Cresceus (2 yrs) 2.48 1-4

Something about the great Cresceus King of trotters and sire of George Cresceus. In the first place there is the fact that Cresceus is a Cresceus. His name alone, when flu in the balance, outweighs those of all the other trotting stallions whose name the golden tongue of fame has uttered. His deeds, his achievements—his long list of world's records where equine speed is known or prized. The gap that separates him from all others of his gait and sex is so wide that it is, in very truth, the case of "Hesperus first and the rest nowhere, over again. It is unnecessary to state his long list of world's records. Every body knows them by heart. For one great thing that any other trotting stallion has ever done, he can show a dozen greater. His crown is thickly encircled with stars, but one of which would be sufficient to confer celebrity on any other horse. With him they are only parts of a "stupendous whole"—a greatness so colossal as to be without precedent or parallel. He was—or is—not alone a speed marvel, but also a giant in strength, a lion in courage, a phenomenon in consistency and wearing power. In the sum of their attributes, some horses—as some men—seem to transcend the limits which nature, as we conceive it, has set. Of these is Cresceus. Every one readily admits this. It can not be denied. And out of all stands this one important fact that he is a stallion—THE ONLY STALLION THAT EVER HAS HELD THE WORLD'S TROTTING RECORD.

George Cresceus 42246, whose 2-year-old cut appears above, is a handsome chestnut horse of splendid conformation, sired by Cresceus and is gaited and jacks like his noted sire. He holds the Provincial 2 year old trotting record mile heats for 1907 which he won at Halifax after a few weeks training, this proving that "blood will tell." Below are some remarks made by the Halifax papers about this fine colt when he raced there.

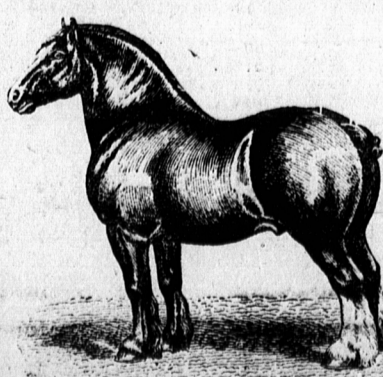
"The big share of the stake went to the chestnut colt from Charlottetown George Cresceus Jr. Cresceus 202, the champion trotting stallion of the world, and George bears a MARKED RESEMBLANCE to his noted sire. The Cresceus Colts met the need of the quartette. The Cresceus colts speed again gave him the lead. The Halifax Chronicle Oct 1907.

After the second heat there was nothing to it, but the Frolicton mare and the great Cresceus whose SUPERIOR BEHAVING seemed to tell in the two final heats which he captured in rather easy style. The Halifax Herald Oct 1907.

At Charlottetown against a field of six Commodore trotters and pacers (half mile heats) he beat the whole field by many lengths, except the pacer Arena Bell which he forced to go to the wire in 1.20 in the half mile heat.
