### PROVINCIAL PROHIBITION.

It is stated in an Ottawa despatch that Sir John Bourinot, who is now a recognized constitutional authority, has given the opinion that a private member is competent to introduce a prohibitory liquor bill in parliament. This is contrary to the opinion generally held heretofore, and yet if Sir John's view should turn out to be the correct one the point is of very considerable importance.

It also appears that in putting forward the proposal of prohibition by provinces as an alternative to a prohibitory law for the entire Dominion, it is contemplated to prohibit both the manufacture and importation as well as the sale of liquors. We have our doubts as to the practicability of such a measure, but if it is constitutional, or power is hereafter given to the provinces to legislate in this way, it would be a decided advance beyond the provisions of the Scott Act.

It is admitted that the provinces have now the legislative power to prohibit the sale of liquors within their jurisdiction, but have not power to stop the manufacture or importation. The same defects pertain to the Scott Act. But if parliament will now enact a law under which the electors of a province, by a majority vote may be enabled to prohibit the manufacture, importation and sale of intoxicants it will go far toward satisfying the temperance people.

It appears that a bill is being prepared by the majority of the prohibition committee along these lines. Its development, its provisions, and what parliament will do with such a bill when it is evolved will be matters of keen interest to the temperance people of Canada during some weeks to come.
