**FACTORY TO OPEN SOON**—Since Monday morning the last two carloads of machinery from Halifax of the National Candy Company have been unloaded and placed in the new plant, the Fyfe Building. At the present time the electric equipment and plumbing are being installed. Mr. Thomas Covie, superintendent of the factory expects to start manufacturing in about a week or ten days. Ten men have been employed in placing the machinery in the building and getting it in readiness. Arrangements are being made to incorporate the new company as quickly as possible. It will be possible to employ between 100 and 150 men in the plant when working to full capacity. However, it is not expected that such a large number will be employed at first. During the last few days a considerable number of shares of stock have been sold.

**500 FARM BOYS TO BE SHIPPED**

LONDON, March 19.—W. C. Nixon, agent-general for Ontario in London, today sent an invitation to all shipping agents in Great Britain to cooperate with his office in sending Ontario this year 500 boy farm learners.

The type desired is "a lad who has a good home training and can be recommended to the Ontario farmer as being in every way suitable to be received into his home as a member of his household."

Last year, Mr. Nixon states, 4,000 similar British boys were successfully placed in Ontario through his office and various immigration agencies.

Many parents, he adds, have written expressing their appreciation of the opportunity given their boys and their entire satisfaction with the arrangements made and their future prospects.




**OYSTER VALUE IS INCREASED BY IODINE FIND**

PARIS, March 19.—Increasing of the quantity of iodine in oysters by artificial means has been accomplished by Drs. Loubate and Salles, who have just communicated to the French Academy of Medicine the results of their research into the therapeutic value of the oyster.

The scientists hold that the value of an oyster resides in great part in the iodine which it contains. They segregated a number of oysters in special pools on the seashore and progressively added iodine to the water. The iodine was absorbed by the oysters, which in turn was absorbed by the oysters.
