THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicants must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency of the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

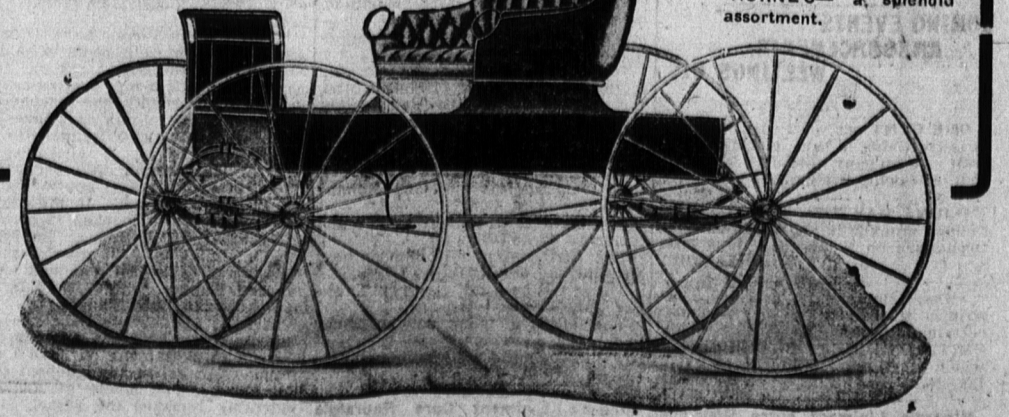
