ISLAND NURSE GRADUATES.—The class of 1918, Framingham Hospital Training Schools for Nurses, whose exercises of graduates were held in High School Assembly hall last evening says a Boston exchange was the largest class yet graduated from the school. It numbers 20, but only 19 were present last evening to receive their diplomas as Miss Ferguson the 20th member, is in service at a sanatorium. A service flag was placed on her chair. The platform was decorated with palms and Green's orchestra furnished music during the exercises and for the dancing which followed. Miss Mary Beard, director of the Boston Educational Nursing association, gave the address, which was both timely and very interesting. She spoke of the excellent work that has been done by the nurses during the war, and said that at all times the nurses have been ready before the beds have been ready to receive the wounded soldiers. She emphasized the great need for district nursing and made a special appeal to the members of the class to take that line of work. During the afternoon proceedings a reception was held at which a pleasing program was rendered, among the graduates was Miss Susanna McPhee, daughter of Mr. George McPhee, O'Leary, who has a diploma from the R. I. Contagious Hospital and the Boston State Board and is now superintendent of the District Nursing in Framingham, Mass.

CANADIANS ON THE WAY TO GERMANY

The following letter has been received by Mrs. M. B. McKenzie from her son in Belgium:

Belgium Nov. 14th, 1918

Dear Mother:— Only few lines to let you know that I am still alive, and in the best of health hoping this will find you the same. No doubt you have heard the news that we have all been looking or, for so long. The great war is over and thank God I am one of the lucky ones who have survived to see the day. We are still in Belgium but are pulling out for Germany. On the 17th we leave from Mons for the grand march into Germany, picked troops. There are as far as I know two divisions of Canadians, 1st and 4th; two divisions of Australians; two of Imperials; two of French and two of Belgians and the 1st and 2nd brigades of Canadian Heavy Artillery. We are in the second brigade.

We go 30 miles beyond the Rhine. Some trip. They claim it is some great honor, but all the honor that I want is to let me get back home where I can get a good feed once more. We are to remain in Germany until peace is declared and I suppose we will get a warm welcome. Ha. Ha. what do you think? anyway I have my rifle in the pink of condition, so I will rely on it as my best friend while I am the guest of our esteemed friends the Huns.

I don't know how long we will be there but I hope not for long. Well I must ring off for this time, for I have a lot of shining to do before the next parade. (damn the shining I would rather be fighting). I remain as ever Your loving son J. M. France Oct. 30th, 1918

Dear father:—

Just a few lines tonight to let you know I am feeling tip-top, hoping this finds you all in the best of health.

We are still pounding away at the Hun, and I think by latest reports he is about all in, and the quicker he throws in the better for all concerned. He knows he is beaten. The war was won last spring but he is like an old horse, his dying struggles are the worst. Well how is everything on the
