**Bad Place For A Bug**  
Never place a small scatter rug at the top of a flight of stairs. There have been many serious accidents caused by this poorly placed rug, and even if it is tucked down, it is dangerous, as a person may catch his feet on its edge and thereby cause a fall.

**Bluing Streaks**  
Do you have trouble with bluing streaks in your laundry? If so, first dissolve your bluing thoroughly in a small quantity of boiling water, stir, and then add it to the rinsing water. This will avoid streaks.

**Pastry**  
It is a mistake to try to stretch pastry to cover the pie pan, as it will only shrink further in the baking. If it does not reach, roll it out a little thinner and then place it in the pie dish.

**THE COOK'S CORNER**

**LEMON ICE BOX PIE**

14 graham wafers  
5 tablespoons butter  
1 tin condensed milk (1 1-3 cups)  
4 eggs  
3 lemons  
4 tablespoons sugar

Method: Make the crust first by crushing the graham wafers very, very fine. Mix them with the melted butter, then press evenly into a buttered pie pan. If you have an oven proof glass one, use that for it looks so pretty.

Be sure to use condensed (not evaporated) milk. It is the sweetened kind. Squeeze the juice from the lemons and grate the rind from two of them. Beat the egg yolks and add these with the lemon juice and grated rind to the milk. Beat all these together until the mixture thickens, then pour carefully into the pan lined with the graham wafer crust.

Beat the egg whites very stiff, then beat into them the 4 tablespoons sugar. Spread roughly over the top of the pie and bake in a slow oven for about 20 to 25 minutes, until the meringue is delicately browned.

Set in the refrigerator for at least six hours or better yet, overnight. Cut and serve. This makes a firm that holds its shape and is light and yet delicate with a rich lemony flavor.
