Keen Racing Is Feature Of Meet At Montague Yesterday

Photo finishes, battles to all parts of the mile and the usual upset victories marked the harness racing meeting held at Montague yesterday when a large sized crowd of spectators saw Kelly's Nightmare, Mary Merk, Shy Ann 2nd and Billy Aubrey come through with victories, with Mary Merk and Billy Aubrey being the only straight heat winners of the day.

Times marked up were fast over a lightning-fast track with starter Rankine McLaine getting his fields away in fast order in every heat of the twelve races.

One horse took a new record, Kelly's Nightmare, a fast improving trotter taking a mark of 2:12 2/5 in winning the second heat of the Classified Trot. Her previous mark established last Saturday was 2:12 3/5.

The Classified Trot, first event on the card, produced close, thrilling finishes in every heat among the four starters. In the first mile the Nightmare, after trailing the Baron who had taken the rail after the word, trotted to the front on the backstretch the second trip around to win by a length in a driving finish, with Lusticia third and Lee Brewer fourth.

In the second heat Kelly's Nightmare made every post a winning one with the Baron coming fast on the last end but not quite able to make the grade. In the third, however, the Baron had his revenge. The Nightmare went away on the rail but a break on the first turn saw her drop back with the Baron going to the front to stay, Lusticia coming on in the last part to furnish the opposition.
