LIBERAL PROSPECTS ARE RAPIDLY VANISHING

(Special to The Guardian)
OTTAWA, Sept. 27.—Isaac Pedlow, M.P., South Renfrew, has announced that he will not again contest that constituency. Two weeks ago he announced he expected an acclamation. Between an acclamation and retirement is a long step, but this only indicates the complete demoralization of the Liberal party in Ottawa.

The Government will now concede five seats to the Liberals in Ontario, and only one in the four western provinces. There are 139 constituencies in Ontario and the four western provinces, and all declare the Government estimate is correct. Of six Liberals, then, Mr. King will be worse off in the next parliament than he is at present.

W. D. Euler, M.P., North Waterloo, was conceded victory by the Government until a few days ago.

PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION FORMALLY OPENED BY HIS HONOR THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

Large Attendance, Eloquent Addresses and Interesting Programme. Exhibits Numerous and of Splendid Quality. Two Interesting Races Yesterday.

The formal opening of the Provincial Exhibition last evening was a splendid success, the large hall being well filled with visitors who enjoyed a most interesting and entertaining programme of addresses, music and vaudeville.

Mr. J. J. Davies, President of the Exhibition Association, in his address, which appears in full below, referred with regret to the unavoidable absence of Hon. W. M. Lea, Commissioner of Agriculture, who was to address the opening ceremony.

His Honor Lieut. Governor Kinnon, in formally opening the exhibition, commented upon the excellent management evident at the exhibition, and the fact that it was a very good one in many respects yet the quality of the agricultural exhibits are very gratifying. It is proof that farming is self-sustaining in this country. The farm feeds the stock and the stock feeds the farm, and the farmer is able to reap good crops even under unfavorable conditions. The speaker alluded to the large interest in cattle, sheep and poultry, which are the mainstay of the farm. The exhibits of vegetables, grain and dairy products are also highly gratifying.

Premier Bell in his address commented upon the success manifested at this exhibition, both outside and inside the building, in cattle, fruit, vegetables and dairy exhibits. The progress made during the past few years has been very rapid. Farms and farm buildings have improved in this island and there is today no country in the world exhibiting more signs of progress. He remembered a few years ago during an election campaign, he was obliged to take a pledge to the farmers that he would fight against automobiles and he did so in order to get their votes. But today the farmers are making ample use of automobiles. He believed that roads of this country are today second to none anywhere, and that a great change has come over public opinion in regard to the feasibility of building good highways here.

His Worship Mayor Riley, in a brief address welcomed heartily the visitors to the exhibition. The following excellent musical programme was carried out during the opening ceremonies last night:

Male Chorus (Director, Prof Fletcher) "I Hear You Calling Me" Song, "Goodbye" (Tosti)—Mr. Charles Earle (encored).

The piano used was very kindly loaned for the occasion by Miller Brothers, city.

Acrobatic and trapeze stunts by the exhibition troupe was an amusing feature of the entertainment. Owing to the unavoidable absence of Mr. Livingstone, Hon. Mr. Lea and Rev. Dr. Gauthier, some of the addresses were omitted.

President's Address

Your Honor, Ladies and Gentlemen.—Before calling upon His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, who has kindly consented to formally open this Exhibition of 1921, I will follow the usual custom of Presidents of this Association in the past, and say a few words. This year we have made a departure from the usual course in the matter of our opening proceedings by advancing the time of the event from noon until evening, and thereby greatly augmenting and enlarging the programme by the addition of the vaudeville performers. We also anticipate short speeches from His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, the Hon. Premier Bell, His Worship the Mayor, the Hon. Mr. Livingstone, the American Consul, the Hon. Mr. Commissioner of Agriculture, the Rev. Dr. Gauthier and others. It will therefore be necessary for me to speak at my great length, and I will confine myself to a reference to the present exhibition.

This is the 29th Exhibition that has been held by the Association on these grounds since its incorporation 31 years ago. In 1890 the first Exhibition was held, and if we had held Exhibitions every year we would now be holding our 32nd show, but through no fault of the Association we were obliged to cancel the Fall Fairs in 1898, 1899 and 1901, but have managed to have held Exhibitions every year since with these three exceptions.

I consider this a remarkable showing when so many Fairs closed during the War. From the year 1900 the Exhibition held here was purely local, and open only to P. E. Island Exhibitors. In that year, and at every show since, we have allowed exhibitors from the Maritime Provinces to compete. In 1915 we made arrangements with the Dominion Live Stock Commissioner for a yearly grant for Live Stock prizes only, and this carried with it the obligation of having our Exhibition open to all of Canada, a condition which existed on two occasions previous to 1915 when we will therefore shortly call upon us also had Dominion grants. His Honor to open the 29th Exhibition of this Association.

In the past twelve years been treated generously by the Local Government irrespective of whether we have always endeavored to show our appreciation by paying out not only all we received from them but a large amount besides in prizes to exhibitors or animals and farm products, and not one cent of federal, local or civil grants has been diverted to race purposes or expenditure. I make this statement because in some localities it has been stated that the money for horse racing should be used for Exhibition prizes. I may here add that the money for the race purses comes altogether from the entry fees, and a donation of \$2,000 given for that purpose by the Merchants Association.

In connection with the local Government Grant we are on a different footing this year from any previous year, by a special arrangement with the Commissioner of Agriculture they pay us up to \$7,000 if our Prize list amounts to that, and on a 50 per cent basis on everything over \$7,000. Owing to this arrangement we are enabled this year to greatly augment our Prize List and are actually offering some \$12,000 in Prizes of one sort or another to Exhibitors over and above the race purses.

The largest sum we have ever offered, I wish to thank the local Government for their generosity, also the Live Stock Commissioner for a \$2,500 grant, the City Council for a \$500 grant, the Canadian Bank of Commerce, for again giving us medals for competition, Messrs. Prowse Bros. Ltd., and Moore and McLeod Ltd., for gifts.

Owing to the assistance given us by the Retail Merchants Association we have been enabled to offer such attractive prizes that we will have the greatest meet here that has ever been held in the Maritime Provinces, and possibly the largest list of entries ever seen together at any racing event in Canada. There are 106 separate horses entered, 25 of which are from Maine. The racing will extend over a period of five days, and some of the horses have records below the 2:05 mark.

I have been connected with this Association ever since it was incorporated with the exception of one year, and I am sorry to see the falling off in the breeding of heavy horses that has taken place in the past three years. Doubtless this is to a great extent due to the arrival of Motor driven vehicles and machinery, but it is a source of great regret that this Province, which was known the world over for its wonderful horses is now seen falling behind in this respect. The Directors of this Association would be willing to offer any inducement to our farmers in the way of additional prizes in order to bring back in some measure at least the condition of affairs as they existed in the Heavy Horse situation some years ago.

We have confined our building operations this year to adding 50 feet to the Machinery Hall, and we have thoroughly disinfected and whitewashed every building on the grounds.

In conclusion I wish to say that it was to our Directorate, and especially to myself a source of deep regret when we learned of the death of Mr. Justice Fitzgerald, a few months ago. Judge Fitzgerald was associated with this Exhibition and was President for five years, and a great deal of success that attended the Association in the past was due to his untiring energy, and wonderful ability. I now have much pleasure in calling upon His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to formally open the Exhibition of 1921.

There was a good attendance at the Exhibition yesterday, although the majority of mainland visitors did not arrive until the evening. The first train yesterday brought about 200 passengers and the Picton boat about 75. In the afternoon the judging started in the main building. The judging of stock will be taken up tomorrow.

The arrangement of the exhibits in the main building this year are about the same as in other years. They are of a high standard of quality, the classes being well filled. The fruit occupy the same central position with the vegetables, grains, dairy products and domestic exhibits, etc., at the north end. Upstairs the women's department takes up the entire eastern side with the art gallery at the north end. Very many thanks are due Mr. Vivian Smallwood for kind attention to exhibitors.

CANADIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY

The interesting and instructive exhibit of the Red Cross Society is one of the important things to be seen by everyone visiting the fair. It illustrates in many striking ways the necessity for public health and child welfare. The exhibit is in charge of Miss MacMahon and Miss W. McLeod, public health nurses, assisted by a section of the exhibit, showing the Every day during the exhibition period from 12 till 2 p.m. prominent subjects of child welfare. One of the exhibits is devoted to illustrating the proper care and feeding of infants, showing the proper clothing to use, etc. A scale is at hand for the purpose of weighing babies. Another scales give the weight and height of children with charts to show the correct weight and height for every age. Two tables are displayed, loaded with various foods, one being marked "Safety First" and the other "Danger, Beware". On the other hand are displayed posters showing the benefits of plenty of sleep for children, of fresh air, good plain food, and of bathing. Everything is designed to make healthful. This display is undoubtedly one of the finest and most complete ever seen here.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS

This splendid exhibit attracts enthusiastic comment from everyone who enters the main building. It comprises some sixty beautiful, colored photographic spots, illustrative of the beauty spots of Canada. The films are on glass frames lighted from behind and present a striking picture of appearance, especially from a short distance. Every province from P. E. I. to far Vancouver is represented. The centre picture is a large colored one of General Byng, Canada's new Governor General. Mr. C. A. M. travelling passenger representative of the C. N. R. is in charge of the exhibit.

DOMINION EXPERIMENTAL STATION

Superintendent J. A. Clark and his capable assistants are showing in the Experimental Station what the future will be accomplished with this year, as usual, is one of the chief centers of interest to visitors. Some interesting models of poultry houses, traps, traps, bee hives, root cellars, self feeders and sies are displayed, besides some choice fruit and vegetables which are a credit to Mr. Brown, the efficient gardener of the institution. A feature of the exhibit is the demonstration of various forms of diseases in potatoes, the comparative yields of healthy and diseased crops, and the practical mixing of Bordeaux Mixture for the potato leaves. This section of the exhibit is in charge of Mr. S. G. Peppin in another portion of the building the results of the dairy tests are announced daily.

AGRICULTURAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL

This is a new and interesting feature of the exhibits this year. The Agricultural and Technical School are to be had free of cost and any inquiries will be gladly answered. Attention is called to the fact that tuition is given free to any boy or young man over fifteen years. Board and sleeping accommodation and text books are supplied at cost price.

P. E. I. HOSPITAL TABLE

The Prince Edward Island Hospital superintendent is doing business at the old stand. The assortment is larger and better than ever, all the goods being donated at the exhibition booth. This display, which is situated on the main floor to the left of the main entrance, should receive a visit from the exhibitors.

BEER & WEEKS

A nicely decorated booth on the main floor of the exhibition building, forty five feet long is that of Messrs Beer & Weeks, the popular local furniture company. Here are displayed various articles of furniture, including a handsome walnut dining room set, a walnut desk, a table with triple mirrors, lamps, and brass bedsteads. Hoover vacuum cleaners and Brunswick phonographs for which this firm has the agency are also exhibited. The whole display has been laid out very artistically by Mr. Arthur Arfleck, who is in charge of the exhibit.
