NEW YORK, April 4 (AP)—Stocks generally continued their rally in today's market although many leaders faltered under profit taking pressure.

A late burst of buying in air-crafts put a few of these up 1 to 3 points, with one 10-share unit issue up 6.

Canadian issues were steadier. Distillers Seagram, Dome Mines, International Nickel, Walkers, Brazilian Tractor, Industrial Alcohol, Ford and Imperial Oil improved slightly. McIntyre, Imperial Tobacco and Lake Shore Mines were easy.

Volume amounted to 1,994,360 shares, largest since the "war boom" spring of last September. It compared with 1,725,240 shares the day before. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks managed to hold a net gain of 4 of a point at 51.2. The uptick in this composite yesterday was 7.

Prominent share favorites at the last, some at new highs for the year or longer, were Lockheed, Wright Aeronautical, Boeing, Douglas Aircraft, Sperry, Glenn Martin, DuPont, Eastman Kodak, Johns-Manville, Chrysler, Kennecott, American Smelting, Southern Railway, Great Northern and American Telephone.

U. S. Steel ended up 1-8 of a point, but Bethlehem and Youngstown Sheet were a shade under water notwithstanding revived hopes for this industry. Loft and McKesson & Robbins dipped, along with Western Union, Dow Chemical, Allied Chemical, and International Harvest Co.
