Narrow Escape The following letter was received by Mrs. Daniel Keenan Wood Island's from her son Pte. Clifford Keenan 14th R. M. R. Battalion. Jack McLeann mentioned in letter is a son of Mr. and Mrs. H. McLeann, Murray River, who was killed in action. 10. 5. 1917. Dear Parents:—Just a few lines to let you know I am living and fairly well. I am in a hospital with some skin disease and am having a great rest. I suppose you heard about Jack McLeann. It is too bad. I was talking to him just before we started out and he asked me if anything happened to him to write to his mother, so I am going to try and fulfil my promise. I helped to bury him away back of the line and gave him a decent burial, so it will be a little comfort for her to know that much. It is just one year ago since I had my furlough and it seems as if it were about ten, but I hope to be home before another year. I had some nice souvenirs I was going to send home and put them in my haversack. The last time we were in the line I took off my equipments while I was digging a hole to get into and Fritz sent a shell over, which dropped on my haversack and I guess you know the rest. I was knocked down the hole and about two feet of earth came down on top of me, but I got out uninjured and picked up some of the pieces, but the haversack is going yet. Couldn't pick it up with blotting paper, but I should worry as long as they don't get my number. I have a German postal stamp. I am going to put in this letter and as I have no news will say good bye. Love to all your loving son. CLIFF.
