BENDER, Bessarabia, Jan. 24.—There is a serious uprising in the vicinity of Kamrat, a Bulgarian colony. The entire population has risen and made prisoners of the local authorities. The Vice Governor who set out with a squad of 150 men, encountered a mob of 15,000 persons, many of whom were armed. The Vice Governor immediately sent couriers for reinforcement and guns. It is reported that many persons have been killed in the neighboring villages.
