LONDON Feb. 29.—The lean days which have fallen upon many newspaper properties in Europe were indicated when the Official Receiver offered at auction the good-will and the

receiver's interest in the machinery and plant of The Daily Standard, for nearly a hundred years a leading London morning post.
The highest bid for the good-will was \$1,000 and for the good-will plus the plant \$50,000. As neither bid approached the minimum fixed by the court the property was withdrawn.

REAL VOICE OF CANADA GIVEN BY CHURCHILL
LONDON, March 1.—Referring to the Rev. A. P. Shafford's specialist at Canada Lodge, A. F. and A. M., on Tuesday night, the Weekly Journal Canada says: "Could it have been heard by the German military staff, it must have filled them with a chill foreboding of the inevitable doom of German militarism. It was the real voice of Canada, expressed by a churchman and a soldier who, after witnessing months of warfare, remains supremely confident."

REMARKABLE HEROISM OF ITALIAN AIRMEN.
ROME, Feb. 29.—Details now made public concerning the recent Italian air raid on Lathach reveal the heroism of Capt. Salomone, pilot of one of the Italian aeroplanes.
On his return journey Capt. Salomone's machine was attacked by five Austrian Fokkers. He was severely wounded in the head and temporarily blinded by blood, while two other officers aboard the aeroplane, one of whom was Lieut.-Col. Barbieri, were killed outright.
Despite the difficulty of steering, the bodies of his dead comrades having fallen over the levers, Salomone refused to surrender. He succeeded in returning, and landed at Talmantova.
Salomone is now recovering in a hospital. A medal has been awarded to him for valor.

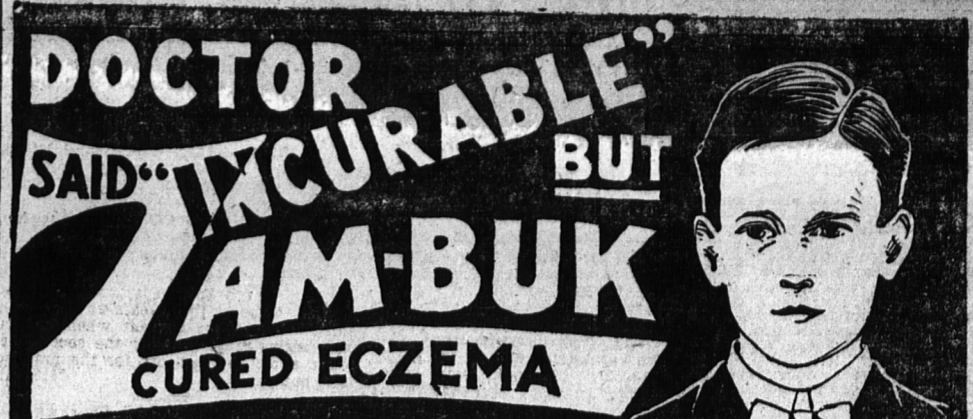

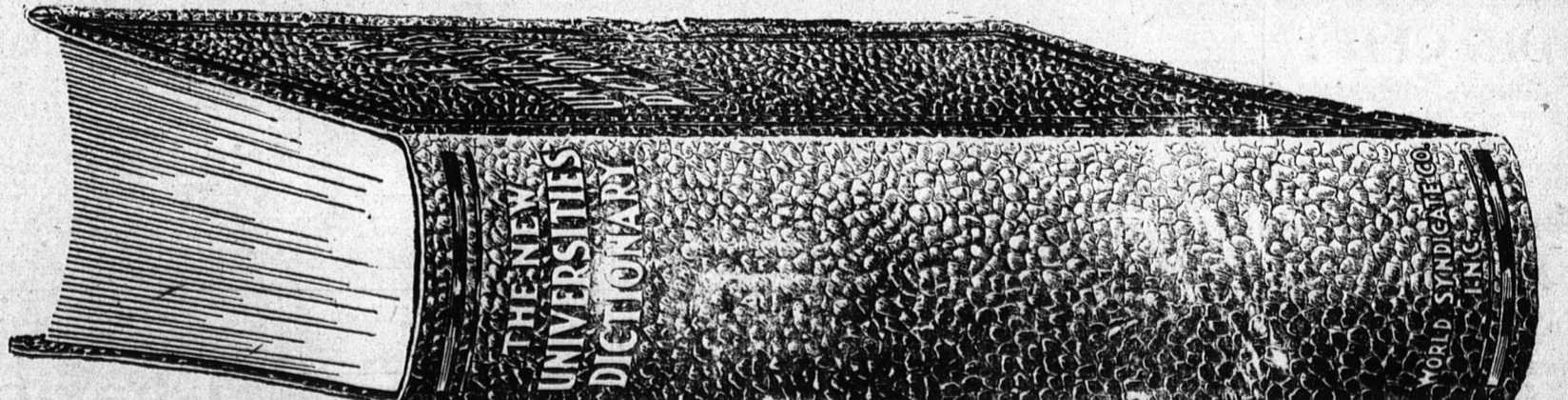
