Tenders for Power House Equipment SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned and marked on the envelope "Tender for Power House Equipment" will be received at the office of the Commissioners of the District of Prince Edward Island, at Charlottetown, until 12 o'clock noon of the 25th day of May, 1910, in connection with the shops east of Winnipeg, including water tube boilers, mechanical stokers, feed water heaters, engines, generators, air compressors, pumps.

Plans and specifications may be seen in the office of the Chief Engineer of the Commissioners, Mr. Gordon Grant, at Ottawa, and in the office of the District Engineer of the Commissioners at St. Boniface, Manitoba.

Persons tendering are notified that tenders will not be considered unless made on the printed form supplied by the Commissioners, which may be had on application to the Chief Engineer at Ottawa, or to the District Engineer at St. Boniface, Man.

Each tender must be signed and sealed by all the parties to the tender, and witnessed, and be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered Bank of the Dominion of Canada, payable to the order of the Commissioners of the Province of Prince Edward Island, for a sum equal to ten per cent (10 p. c.) of the amount of the tender.

Any person whose tender is accepted shall within ten days after the acceptance thereof sign the contract, specifications, and other documents required to be signed, and in any case of refusal or failure on the part of the party whose tender is accepted to complete the contract, the said contract shall be forfeited to the Commissioners as liquidated damages for such refusal or failure, and all contract rights acquired by the acceptance of the tender shall be forfeited.

The cheques deposited by parties whose tenders are accepted will be deposited to the credit of the Receiver General of Canada, as security for the due and faithful performance of the contract according to its terms.

The cheques deposited by parties whose tenders are rejected will be returned within ten days after the signing of the contract.
