It is of interest to note what impres-
 sions are formed of the Island and its
 people by those who visit us from time
 to time, especially those who make a sum-
 mer stay in our midst. We therefore
 with pleasure transfer to our columns the
 following highly appreciative notice by
 one of the number which appeared in a
 recent issue of the 'Daily Journal of Mil-
 ford, Mass:

For nineteen summers I am in and in the
 Gulf of St. Lawrence has given a tired
 worker the rest he has craved. With its
 beautiful scenery, its refreshing climate,
 its clear invigorating air, it is an ideal
 place in which to recuperate. With farms
 so well kept as to make the whole country
 look like a well kept park, with people
 whose hospitality is so hearty and homely
 as to make it a joy to be with them, with
 ponds and rivers whose inhabitants seem
 to be waiting for a friend to come and
 take them "in out of the wet," there are
 few, if any places offering the same at-
 tractions.

The simple life, the pure and innocent
 spirit of the people, and their old-fash-
 ioned and staunch religious life produce
 an environment delightful and uplifting.
 Prince Edward Island is a little world by
 itself. With more than two hundred
 miles of railway, it is large enough so
 that is no danger of stepping off in the
 dark. With its abundance of trout, both
 salt water and fresh, and its broods of
 duck, snipe and plover, there is enough to
 awaken the enthusiasm of an amateur
 sportsman and to satisfy the passion of an
 expert.

The habits of the people compel a vis-
 itor to straighten himself up a little, to
 his own moral profit. Not a pleasure sail
 is ever spread on Sunday, except when
 the water offers the best way to a house
 or worship, either Protestant or Catholic,
 the cessation of all labor on that day,
 that a farmer saving his hay on that day
 after a week of storm, would forfeit the
 respect of all his neighbors—these things
 indicate conditions that are unusual
 among us. There are no electric rail-
 ways on the island to rattle round on
 Sunday. There is only one automobile,
 and that is housed on that day, as it is
 used as a public conveyance to visit the
 park in the chief city.

It is certainly one of the most restful
 and delightful places to which one can
 run for his holiday hiding place.
 While this is late as a suggestion for the
 present season, it is sufficiently early to
 guide the wise for another year.

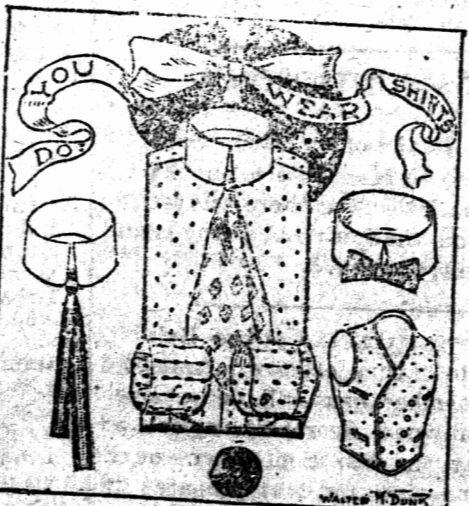
