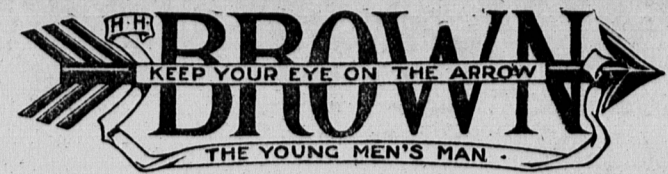


LAME GIRL WALKS; CALLS IT MIRACLE.

BOSTON, June 14—After having been an invalid and unable to walk for years, Miss Francis Little of 116 Draper Street, Dorchester, created a sensation yesterday morning when she walked a quarter of a mile from her home to St. Peter's Catholic Church and appeared at mass, apparently quite recovered from the malady which had rendered her leg useless and necessitated a dozen futile operations during the last six years. The young woman was acclaimed as having been healed by a miracle. She said that relief came to her while praying last Thursday afternoon before the shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre, in Canada. She had been suffering severe pain for months, and had been unable even to rest her foot upon the floor. When she left Boston a week ago Saturday to visit the shrine she had to be carried from her home to a hack, and at the North Station had to be lifted out and upon the train.

AERONAUTS DROP 8,000 FEET.

ST. LOUIS, June 14—J. D. Wooster Lambert, who came into possession of \$1,800,000 when he reached his majority recently, fell 8,000 feet into the Mississippi River at Baden, north of St. Louis, recently, while making his maiden trip in the 78,000-cubic foot St. Louis No. 3 of the Aero Club of St. Louis, with Louis von Phul as pilot. Both were rescued by a motor boat. The balloon was also saved. It travelled only eight miles on account of the calm in the upper air. To seal air currents they rose 8,000 feet. When they decided to descend the rip and valve cords were found entangled. The fall was not checked until within 200 feet of the river. The basket with Von Phul in it struck the water hard, but was held up by the gas in the bag. Lambert was perched in the rigging.

NEWSPAPER PRINTED THE WRONG PICTURE.

NEW YORK, June 14—Josephine Davis, the vaudeville actress, who lives at 1773 Union Street, Brooklyn, is suing a Toronto paper for libel for printing her picture with a caption below to the effect that she was the wife of Jack Johnson, the pugilist.

According to Miss Davis' lawyers, Karlin and Busch, of 320 Broadway, the Canadian newspaper used Miss Davis' picture in its issue of April 8. The caption read as follows:—"Mrs. Jack Johnson, wife of the champion pugilist of the world, who will appear at the Gayety Theatre this afternoon and evening and tomorrow afternoon and evening."

It appears that Johnson was playing at a vaudeville house during that week. The management at the Gayety had engaged Mrs. Jack Johnson who it is known as a white woman, as a rival attraction.

The suit will be tried in the High Court of Justice shortly for unnamed damages.

Miss Davis, who is the wife of a New York physician, has played in Toronto several times.

Miss Davis' attorneys will endeavor to subpoena both Johnson and his wife.

GOLD IN BRITISH COLUMBIA.

PRINCE RUPERT, June 15—A gold strike is reported on Bald Mountain, ten miles from Stewart. A reef of free milling gold ore, assaying \$50 to the ton, can be traced for nearly five miles.

Stewart is becoming depopulated. Many miners are leaving for the discovery.

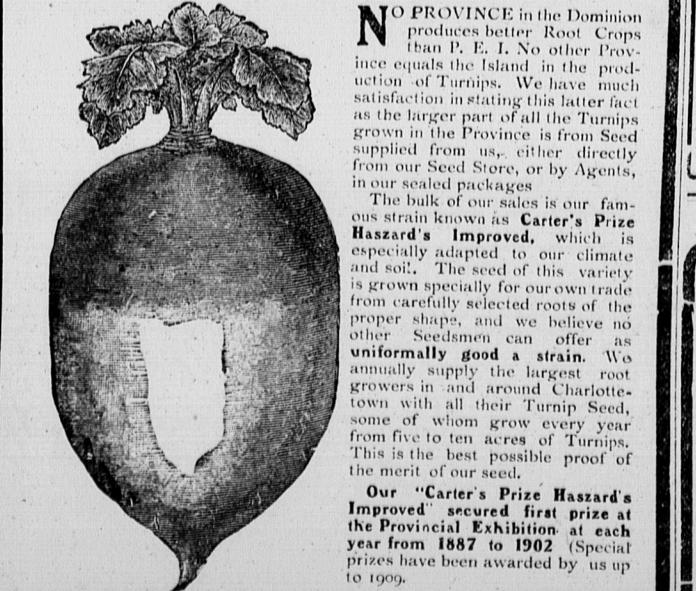
