Hints for the Motorist

BY ALBERT L. CLOUGH CARBURETOR OVERFLOWS

R. D. N. writes: My carburetor leaks so badly that when I garage the car at night, I have to put a dish under it, to catch the gasoline and also to fill the empty vacuum tank before starting in the morning. Do I need a new carburetor? Answer: Probably not. The trouble most likely is that the automatic float-valve in the carburetor bowl fails to close tightly and thus allows so much gasoline to enter that the bowl overflows.

RETARDING THE SPARK ON OVERLOADED ENGINE

E. O. G. asks: When a truck engine is laboring hard on high or second gear, does it injure it to retard the spark? Answer: No. This is the very procedure required, as otherwise it is likely to knock and knocking is merely the sign of severe strains that the parts are being subjected to, because the charges are being exploded too early. It is, however, very poor practice to permit an engine to slow down so greatly, under load, that it labors or runs somewhat unevenly.

UNCERTAIN GASOLINE FEED

A. R. G. writes: My engine occasionally stops, while the car is on the road, seemingly from fuel pump stoppage. It purrs and runs on often stops, while idling, after it has been running for a few minutes. After waiting a short time, it usually starts it again. Can this trouble be in the carburetor? Answer: Yes. It may be that the gauze strainer in the fitting, where the fuel pipe enters the float chamber, is very nearly obstructed with sediment, and needs cleaning. There is also a possibility that the vacuum system is at fault. If, when the engine stops in the way you describe, there is plenty of gasoline in the vacuum tank but very little in any in the carburetor bowl, the trouble may be attributed to the carburetor bowl, the carburetor, but if the vacuum tank supply is exhausted, the difficulty is probably in the vacuum system. In this case, clean the strainer at the entrance to the vacuum tank and see that the main gasoline line in the vacuum and supply lines and makes sure that the flapper-valve of the tank is not unseated by dirt.

ABRASIVE FOR LAPPING CYLINDERS

R. A. M. asks: What is the best abrasive to use in lapping scored cylinders? Answer: An ordinary valve grinding compound, mixed with engine oil, is as good as anything. These consist of quartz powder or carborundum, as a rule, but emery can be used. A fine grade is advisable for this use.
