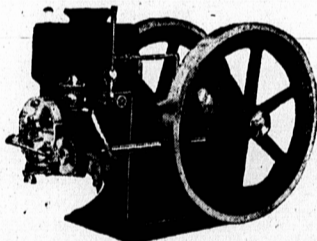

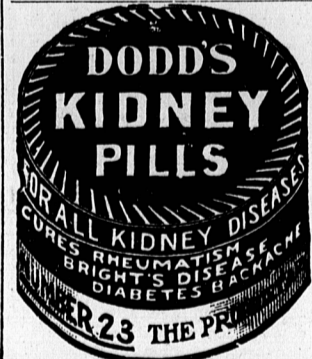

CROP REPORT FOR NOVA SCOTIA AND N. B.

Hay—Estimated Yield

In the Counties of Kings, Annapolis, Lunenburg, Queens and Digby the crop will not be more than 2 of that 1908. In Yarmouth, the crop will be superior to that of 1908. In Hants, Colchester, Cumberland, Pictou, Antigonish, Halifax and Guysboro, the crop will be about 90 per cent, as compared with that of 1908, and in the four Cape Breton Counties, about 92 per cent. It is evident from this that the rains have so materially benefited the hay-fields of Eastern Nova Scotia did not come in time for the fields in Kings, Annapolis, etc, where vegetation was more forward.

To offset the deficiency of the present year's crop, many farmers more especially in Hants, Colchester, Cumberland, Pictou, as well as parts of Annapolis and Lunenburg have on hand from 5 to 15 per cent of last year's hay.

OATS AND OTHER GRAINS.

Estimated Yield. Compared with 1908 98 per cent. Compared with average 98 per cent. With few exceptions correspondents report the present outlook for oats and other grains as most satisfactory. Earlier in the year the outlook was anything but promising, but as the result of the abundant rain in July the grain fields are in a most satisfactory condition.

POTATOES.

However it is too soon to predict much about this crop, which is always liable to be infested with rot, and also to be seriously injured with other fungi and insects.

INDIAN CORN AND OTHER FORAGE CROPS.

Correspondents generally report an increase of acreage of land devoted to these crops, which are used for the most part to supplement the mid-summer and early fall pasturage. The present indications are for a crop fully equal to that of last year, which was an average year.

PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK

I may say, however, in a general way, that the hay crop of the Province, outside of the Bay of Funday marches, will probably run about twenty five per cent short of the average crop. From advices received from the marsh districts, the crop there will likely exceed the average. All classes of grain and roots—particularly potatoes promise a full crop; the potato acreage is much increased over any previous year; and were it not for a good deal of missing in St John River section, we could feel reasonably sure of a very large crop. Weather conditions have lately been most favorable. We had two weeks of magnificent haying weather and the last week's copious and wide-spread rainfall will prevent the too early ripening of grain and will help the potatoes and other roots immensely. Al-

though our days have been very of onably cool and there are as yet no indications of rust in either grain or potatoes. Red leaf in the oat crop has been very prevalent, but since it does not seem to materially affect the grain yield, especially when it does not appear till late, we do not think it will damage the crop to any extent. There is a little complaint in some sections of trouble among oats similar to what effects timothy, the stock being perforated and causing the head to die. I do not think this trouble is sufficiently wide-spread to materially affect the crop.

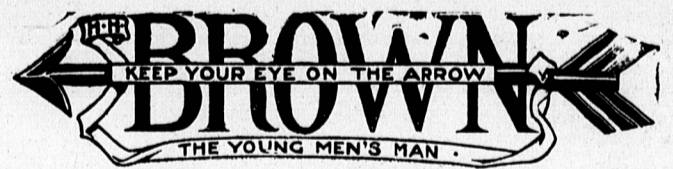

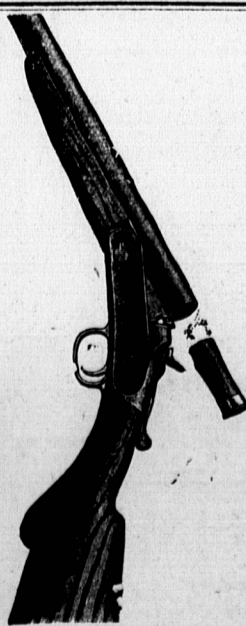
