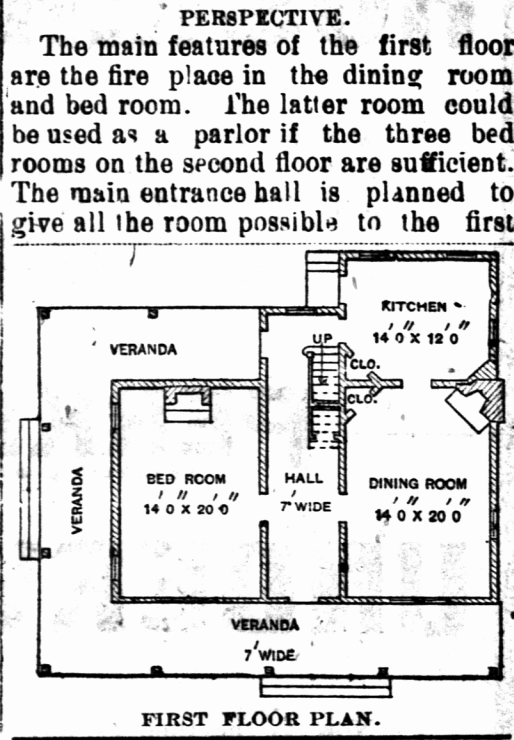

structed to receive ceiling boards or plaster. The ceiling boards would have a firm nailing on the studding with a layer of paper between making a dry house and giving good bracing to the building. Where the veranda roof joins to main building, joints are well flashed with good heavy leaded roofing tin as is also the case with all exposed window caps, ridges and valleys. A technical description of this design is given at the end of the article. The perspective view will appeal to any one thinking of building a cottage near the sea-shore principally because of its veranda and French casement windows, which combine a number of pleasant features. The veranda running three sides of the house gives a view from almost any point and throwing open the doors and windows on the first story, would keep the house cool in the warmest weather if there was the slightest breeze. We give herewith the technical description of this design:

General Dimensions: Width, exclusive of piazza, 37 ft.; depth, exclusive of piazza, 33 ft. 6 ins. Heights of Stories: First story, 9 ft.; second story, 8 ft. Exterior Materials: Foundations, posts; side walls, clapboards; gables, panels; roof, shingles. Interior Finish: Walls and ceilings ceiled with narrow N. C. pine boards. Flooring throughout, N. C. pine. All interior woodwork grain filled and varnished. Plaster should be used on walls and ceilings, to make it a warm, all-year residence. Colors: Clapboards and panels, dark red; trim, veranda posts, e.c., dark green; sashes, white. Accommodations: The rooms, closets, etc., are shown by floor plans. Closet under stair case. Thimble for connecting stove in kitchen with chimney. House designed for wooded location, for summer use, but is adapted for use the whole year if necessary. Cost: \$1,500, complete. The estimate is based on New York prices for materials and labor. In many sections of the country the cost should be less.

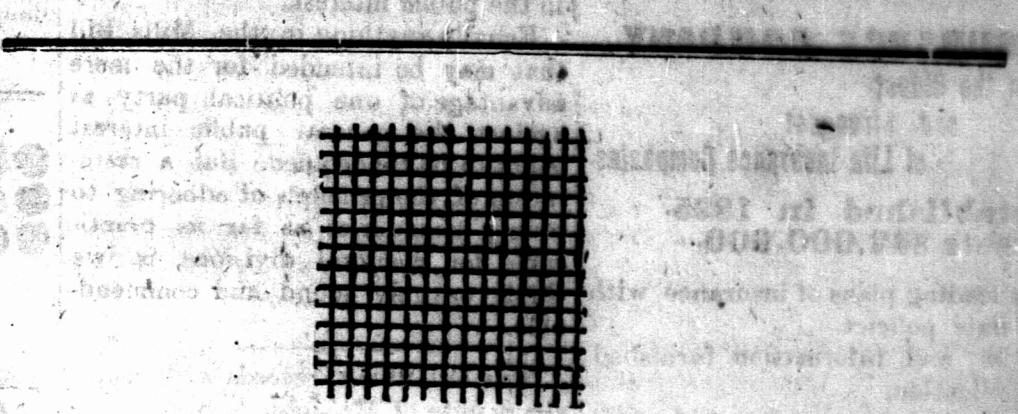

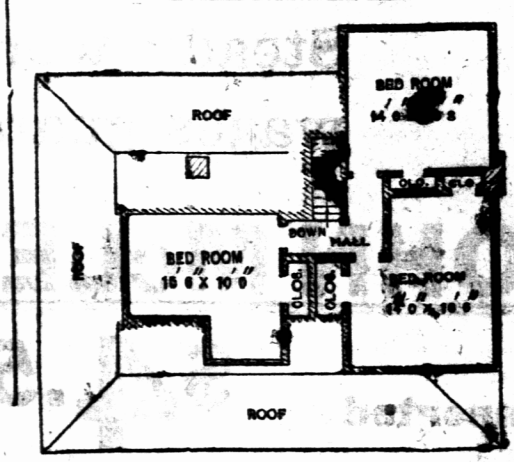


The design illustrating this article is planned for a sea-shore or mountain home. The foundation is of 6" locust set 6" apart with large flat stones at the bottom of same. Sill is spiked to the posts set square and plumb and with joints set on same and studding run down to sill and spiked to the floor beams.

room. The kitchen is planned so as to have direct connection with the stove pipe of the dining room flue saving the expense of an extra chimney. At the rear of the main hall, door enters on rear veranda and in warm weather this door and the front entrance door could be left open causing circulation of air and carrying off the unnecessary heat. The French casement windows which will be noticed in the perspective view in the first story are very convenient, as these also give a good circulation of air and give direct exit from any room to the veranda which is desirable feature in summer cottages. These windows are raised 7" from the floor and swing out, as a casement window that swings in can never be made to keep out rain except they be especially detailed and made to order and are then quite expensive. The veranda posts and brackets are made of 6 x 6" planed yellow pine, well anchored to still and plate and chamfered.



The second story bed rooms at side walls give head room of about 5 feet and then slope off about on an angle of 45 degrees to the height of the room which is 8 feet. There is plenty of space between the ceiling and floor to take off the strong heat of the middle of the day. A good feature of these rooms is the closets, which are simple for a summer cottage of this kind. In the second story could be introduced a bath room and linen closet, if desired; it would bring the cost of the house, however, up to about \$1700, which would include the bath room fixtures.
