Former Islander John McLeod Dies

County Surveyor John D. McLeod, 78, widely-known Helena resident for nearly 40 years and former councilman, city engineer and fire chief, passed away at St. Peter's Hospital about 3:40 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

Mr. McLeod was first named to the position of county surveyor on the republican ticket in November, 1898. He served until 1900, then dropping out of the country political race until 1906 when he was elected to the office for another term.

In 1920 he was elected city commissioner, serving in that capacity for one two-year term, after which he became chief of the Helena fire department for one year before being appointed to the office of city engineer during the administration of Mayor John Dryburgh.

In November, 1925, Mr. McLeod again was elected county surveyor, serving until his death. In recent years he generally had been unopposed for the office on the republican ticket.

Mr. McLeod was nominated for the county surveyor's position in the July primaries. His untimely death leaves a vacancy on the republican ticket, an opinion concerning which will be issued by County Attorney Harold K. Anderson, he announced yesterday.

Mr. McLeod was born June 18, 1860, on Prince Edward Island, Canada, his father, Donald N. McLeod, having been brought there from Scotland when 8 years of age. Here on his small Canadian Island his father lived until time to own and cultivate a homestead of his own. His was shared by Miss Janet McLean, whom he married in 1859. Nine children were born to these nature-loving people, of whom John D. was the eldest.

Mr. McLeod, the first born of the family, lived with his parents and attended the grade schools and the high school on the island until his 17th year, when he began to earn his own expenses by fishing during the summer months that he might continue his studies in the winter. He chose to spend much of the four years of advanced study in fitting himself for a civil engineer. At the age of 23 he became an expert surveyor, leaving out many towns in the Dakotas and afterward aiding with the railroad survey throughout Montana and Washington.

In 1888 he was married to Miss Lella Sheppard of Taylor Falls, Minn., their union occurring at Bismarck, N.D., where Miss Sheppard was at the time making her home. This union two children were born, Beatrice, the daughter, who now is Mrs. Ross Allen, Sr., of this city, and a son, Blaine. Mrs. McLeod passed away in June of 1899.

In 1902 Mr. McLeod was married to Miss Mattie Farquhar. There were three children born of this union, Marjorie, Miriam and Donald. Donald died in 1928.

Mr. McLeod was a member of Helena lodge No. 3, A.F. & A.M., which he served as treasurer. He also was a member of the Scottish Rite and the Algonquin Shrine, and served as a member of the board of directors of the Acacia brotherhood. He also was affiliated with the Woodmen of the World.

Besides his wife and Mrs. Allen he was survived by two other daughters, Mrs. George Callaghan, of East Orange, N.J., and Miriam McLeod of this city; one son James B. McLeod, New York city; two brothers, Norman and John McLeod of Prince Edward Island; two sisters, a Mrs. Nicole of Prince Edward Island and Mrs. Charles Hillier of Oakland, Calif.; four grandchildren and four great grandchildren.
