BURIED THE DEAD AT MAGERSFONT

Boers Cosoperated Wite the British in Performi
Service for the Gallant Men Who Fell.

MODDER RIVER, Dec. 18.—Mu u l arrangements we made by the British and Boer commanders, by which the British dead were to be buried on Wednesday and Thursday. The Boers stipulated, however, that only a clergyman of the Reformed Church should officiate, and that the British should not come within 600 yards of their lines. Mr. Robertson, the Presbyterian chaplain, of one of the Highland regiments,

who had previously been of great help, was selected to conduct the burial services. He took twenty engineers with him and started for the scene of the battle of Magersfontein. The engineers, who acted as litter bearers, were blinded when they reached the Boer outpost.

General Cronje, the Boer commandant, sent a message regretting that he could not come personally to receive the burial party, but he said that other affairs engaged his attention at the time. He sent Commandant Vermaas, Intelligence Office Draper, and Field Cornet Wills to assist Mr. Robertson in locating the dead. A few of the Boers cast fanatic glares at the party, but the majority of them co-operated with the English in the kindest manner. They said they would have given full details regarding the English dead, wounded and prisoners, if the British had furnished them with similar information. The English officials had already prepared these details and had them ready. Chaplain Robertson buried thirty-two on Wednesday and thirty-one on Thursday.

A man in a trench is just as safe from a shower of bullets as if he were behind the wall of a fortification. Indeed, it has been shown that earthworks thrown up by soldiers are a safer protection from rifle bullets than masonry.

Sir George White and his gallant men at Ladysmith can therefore easily protect themselves from the fire of the enemy. Ladysmith is surrounded by more or less level ground, and cannot be approached by the Boers on any side without exposing themselves to a line of position for which they have no liking.

The ordinary rifle bullet only penetrates a few inches into the mud and soil heap d up beside trenches. The Lee-Metford will go further than the Mauser, and the Martini-Hauer, the

bullet from a large Maxim gun are just as effectively arrested by this form of breastwork as they would be by the side of a brick wall.

Nothing is so hard to take as an entrenched position. Artillery is the only effective means of driving soldiers out of trenches, but this can only be done by the most accurate kind of firing, which explodes the shells exactly over the trenches, together with a large number of guns and the expenditure of a vast quantity of ammunition.

During the Spanish-American war American soldiers at Santiago found that they could lie in the trenches and read and smoke in perfect safety while showers of bullets were flying overhead.
