Teachers Resign Positions in New Westminster

NEW WESTMINSTER, B. C., Dec. 1.—The resignation of eighty-seven teachers from the high, technical and public schools of the city were accepted last night by the Board of School Trustees. The resignations, which take effect Dec. 31, were handed in last week as a protest by the teachers against alleged unfair treatment in the matter of salaries. A motion to dismiss teachers, who had not handed in their resignations was dismissed.

American Vessels Lead In Tonnage Over New Route

WASHINGTON, Dec 3—Ships of four nations carried 89 per cent of the approximately 11,600,000 tons of cargo which moved through the Panama Canal during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1921. American vessels led all others with a total of 5,153,000 tons, establishing a new record by increasing the total tonnage of the previous high year by \$15,885. British ships were second and surpassed even the high mark of 1917, their last banner year.

Australia And Question Of The Asiatics

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Dec. 5—Patently and persistently, Sir Joseph Carruthers is pushing his project, "A Million Farmers on a Million Farms." In the Methodist Lyceum Hall, before the members of the Commercial Travellers' Club, and at a meeting of the New South Wales Labor Council, Sir Joseph is explaining his scheme for increasing settlement in Australia. The cordial reception which he received at the Trades Hall gathering and the vote of thanks accorded him there have surprised many people, as Labor's attitude toward immigration has been generally antagonistic. The fact that Sir Joseph is not advocating an indiscriminate policy of immigration accounts in part for the reception he received, but it is also true that thinking Australians are recognizing that their land must have a white population sufficient in numbers to defend it. Sir Joseph Carruthers emphasizes that there are 1,100,000,000 white people to 550,000,000 white people, but whereas the bulk of the white are thousands of miles away in Europe and North America, the colored people are at Australia's doors. The challenge offered to Australia by these Asiatic neighbors must be met, he declares, and the Australian claim of a white Australia must be justified by reason and facts. "We are on friendly terms with Japan, but we never know what will eventuate," declared Sir Joseph. "Scraps of paper will never keep people from quarrelling, and there is less affinity between ourselves and the Japanese than between British and Germans. The Japanese

NEW CHINESE CUSTOMS TARIFF 7 1-2 PER CENT. PLUS OCTROI DUTIES

Proposals Introduced by Sir Robert Borden Accepted by Countries Except Japan, Which is Expected to Come Into Line.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.—Stoic agreement on the Chinese customs questions was reached today by the Underwood sub-committee. China asked for an ad valorem tariff of 12 1-2 per cent. The sub-committee today decided to recommend the grant of one of 7 1-2 per cent, plus interior octroi duties amounting to not more than 2 1-2 per cent. Japan dissents from the decision of all the other countries, protesting, insisting that China shall continue to levy five per cent, the present tariff. In order to be able to submit a unanimous recommendation to the full committee, Senator Underwood requested the Japanese to reconsider their position and determine whether they cannot step into line with the other delegations in this matter. This, the Japanese have undertaken to do, and it is generally expected that the sub-committee will be able to report favorably to the committee on Far Eastern questions by the end of the week. The new tariff proposals were introduced by Sir Robert Borden (Canada) and encountered no serious opposition outside that of Japan, the general feeling being that China must be allowed to derive considerably more revenue for national purposes from their customs.
