IS MUCH SURPRISED.

Archbishop Begin's Attitude to Father O'Leary's Case—Won't Consider the Petition if Presented.

QUEBEC, January 2.—The secretary of Archbishop Begin, Rev. Monseigneur Arsenault, makes the following statement in reference to the petition which is said to be in circulation, asking the cardinal to discipline Father O'Leary for having read the Protestant burial service over the soldiers who fell at Paardeberg: "His grace is much surprised at the report which he hardly believes worthy of notice or consideration. It is true that Roman Catholic clergy are forbidden to take part in Protestant services, but no official information of Father O'Leary having done so has been received. Even if he did read the English church service it must be remembered that he was acting in the presence of death and under the shadow of the tomb, and there is certainly nothing in the canons of the Roman church forbidding Roman Catholic clergy to pray for Protestant dead." Father Arsenault stated in reply to a direct question that it was very unlikely that any consideration would be given to the petition, even if it were received by his grace. There is a good deal of indignation among the more broad minded of Roman Catholics here over the matter and it is probable that now the petition will be dropped.

The First Thousand.

TORONTO, Jan. 2.—F. H. Clergue, the new Ontario capitalist and pulp manufacturer, under contract with the government to bring one thousand families yearly into New Ontario, now in England cables that one thousand persons will sail for Canada in February and March. Clergue proposes to open an immigration office in Norway and to get Scandinavians adept in the pulp trade.

CHICAGO, January 2.—The Tribune says a Chicago packing firm will supply the Russian government this year with 1,500 barrels of specially prepared meat to feed the soldiers of the czar's army. It is believed this contract is merely the predecessor of others which will amount to millions of dollars and result in the introduction and consumption of American packed meats in every part of the vast northern empire. A new process of packing and pickling meat was an important factor in the awarding of the contract. The problem of transporting packed meat any distance and through any climate without affecting the quality has been solved.
