## CAR FULL OF MEN A. T. PATRICK'S LIFTED BY WIND LAST APPEAL

CHEYENNE, Wis., Oct. 20—As the result of an unprecedented accident on the Union Pacific at Lone Tree Creek, thirty miles west of Cheyenne, last night, six laborers are known to be dead, and several others probably injured, many seriously. A terrific wind picked up the caboose of a work train, tore it away from its couplings and carried it over the edge of a fill. It dropped thirty feet with its forty occupants, nearly all of whom were section laborers and the terror-stricken men were piled in helpless confusion among the wreckage when it landed.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 20—The motion of Albert T. Patrick, the New York lawyer who is serving a life sentence at Sing-Sing prison on the charge of murdering William T. Rice, a Texas millionaire, for an appeal from the United States circuit court of New York, denying him a writ of habeas corpus and which is supposed to have been prepared by Patrick himself, will, it is expected, be presented to the supreme court tomorrow.

## YOUNG DRUG CLERK COMMITTED SUICIDE

OTTAWA, Ont., Oct. 20—J. A. Pink, a drug clerk, twenty-five years of age, committed suicide by shooting himself in the head with a rifle at his lodging place on Somerset Street this morning. He left no note or message to explain his self-destruction and nothing unusual in his actions was noticed by his friends lately.

## RICH MAN NOW DRIVES HORSE CAR

## FRENCH COLONIAL GOVERNOR RESIGNS

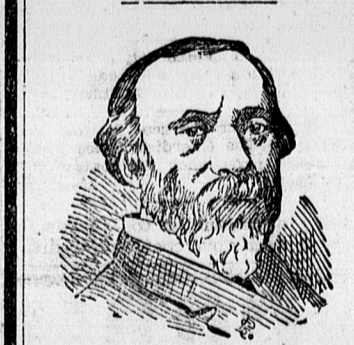
ST. PIERRE, Miq., Oct. 20—Governor Antoinetti of the French colony of Miquelon has resigned his position and will no longer make his residence here, according to information received from the colonial department in Paris, because of political differences between him and Louis Legasse, a member of the French chamber of deputies. Following his resignation of the Miquelon governorship, Governor Antoinetti accepted the office of secretary general to France at Dahomey, one of the French possessions on the west coast of Africa. The governor went to Paris recently and placed the matter before the colonial officials in an attempt to adjust it. He was offered the cross of the Legion of Honor and urged to return to the Miquelon governorship but he declined.

## RUSHES OUT OF WOODS AND SHOTS TO KILL

MONTREAL, Oct. 20.—Harold Patterson, aged seventeen, son of Col. Patterson, and a companion, Gordon West, aged eighteen, were in a field near Longueuil this afternoon when a man rushed out of the woods armed with a revolver, and fired at the two youths, hitting both. Patterson now lies in the general hospital with but slight hopes of recovery. West was not severely wounded. No reason is known for the attack, and no trace of the man has been discovered.
