After leaving the last mentioned place at 6 p. m. on Saturday last stormy weather was met with. Heavy S. E. gales lashed the sea into fury, and it was owing to careful management on the captain's part, that no damage was sustained. The ship brought a large number of sheep and four passengers in steerage.—St. John's Telegram.
