Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may be entitled to a quarter-section of available Dominion land in any of the provinces of Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land to each of three years. A homesteader may live within time limits of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, subject to certain conditions. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$2000.

At the City market yesterday the price of oats was from forty-four to forty-eight cents for white and forty-six to forty-eight for black, the price of eggs fell to nineteen and twenty cents per doz, the only other change being that of pressed hay, which sold at eight dollars and eight fifty per ton, the other prices remaining the same that of pork being per lb eight and a quarter to eight and three quarters cents, geese each one dollar to one twenty-five, turkey sixteen to eighteen cents per lb, butter per lb twenty-two to twenty-three cents, licks one dollar to one twenty-five per pair and chickens seventy five cents to one dollar, loose hay forty to forty-five and loose straw twenty-five to thirty cents and pressed straw per ton five dollars.
