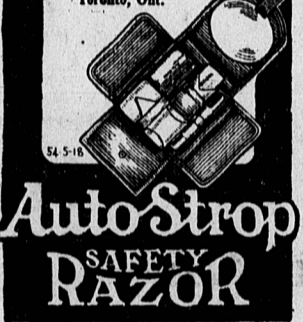

DIED OF WOUNDS

Mrs. R. Hughes, 109 Pownal Street, city has received the following letters regarding her son's death:

First Canadian Casualty Clearing Station France, Oct. 27, 1918

Dear Mrs. Hughes:— Before this letter reaches you, you will have received official notification of the death of your son, Richard M. Hughes. He was admitted to this hospital a few days ago, suffering from very severe wounds received in battle. He was then perfectly conscious and rational but I immediately perceived that his condition was critical; and so I had him go to Confession, after which I administered to him the sacrament of Extreme Unction. I buried him yesterday afternoon in a small French Cemetery. His grave is in the immediate neighborhood of an ancient church.

You and your family have my sincerest sympathy in your great bereavement. But you can never thank God sufficiently for the beautiful Catholic death with which he blessed your son.

Dear Mr. Hughes:— I regret to inform you of the death of your son, 320410, Pte. R. I. Hughes at this hospital. He was brought here at 3 a.m. on the 25th suffering from wounds of the abdomen and in a very low condition and died at 11 a.m. without being fully conscious.

He was visited by the R. C. chaplain and has been buried in the Eglise St. Joseph Cemetery some distance from Douai. Any personal belongings he may have had will be forwarded to you later through official channels and may not reach you for some time. I regret that owing to your son's condition he was too ill to give us any personal messages for any of you but you can rest assured that he is at rest after having done his duty.

PERSONAL APPRECIATION OF A GALLANT SOLDIER



PRIVATE GEORGE W. BIRT

The following references to Private Birt, son of Mr. Wm. H. Birt, Cove Head Road will be read by relatives and friends with much interest and sympathy.

The two following letters of personal appreciation have been received this week by Mrs. Geo. Birt, Grand Forks, B. C., whose husband, Pte. Geo. W. Birt, died from wounds in France recently.

"I very greatly regret to have to tell you of the death of your gallant husband, Pte. Geo. W. Birt, who died Sept. 29th from wounds received in action. I am proud to be able to tell you that he died as he had lived, absolutely fearless to the end and of his glory and the manner of his death you must be very proud. Even when mortally wounded his first thought was for his officer, Lieut. McCallum, close by whose side he was at the time. When he had assured himself that the officer was not wounded his every thought was of you and the little ones.

"So grieve with him with great pride in the glory which is his, for it is such wonderful, faithful and gallant boys as he who have made the name of Canada immortal. His death has been a blow to this battery for he was ever very popular with all of us and in his death we have lost a very gallant soldier. All ranks of the battery join with me in sending you our heart-

felt sympathy in your great loss. F. C. Ross, captain commanding 10th C. L. T. M. Battery."

"I write you to express the deep sorrow I feel for you in the loss of your husband. George was my man and was with me wherever I went. In addition to being a helper in every difficulty he was my friend and I miss him very much. He was with me when he came by the wounds which caused his death. A shell landed in the midst of our party and of ten I was the only one who escaped. I did what I could for him which was very little in the heat of the battle. I saw his wounds dressed and sent him to the dressing station and had great hopes of him pulling through, and it was a blow when the news came of his death. Before I left he gave me his watch, ring, pocketbook and pen which I have forwarded to you under registered mail.

"George, I know was a true man and you have lost a loving and dutiful husband. He was a great favorite in the Battery and his loss is keenly felt by all of us who are left. Our genuine sympathy goes out to you in your deep sorrow. J. M. McCallum, Lieut. 10th C. L. T. M. Battery."
