**The Importance Of
The Drug Store**

PHARMACY WEEK, OCT. 19-24

Today there are 3700 drug stores in this country managed by professionally trained men and women, graduates of the colleges of Pharmacy. The drug store renders an important service to your community. You would not care to live in a community in which there were no drug stores.

The lights of the corner pharmacy burn until the late hours of the night. Like many other important things in life, the drug store is accepted in a matter-of-fact manner. The essential service of a drug store makes it stand out as a community need.

In the drug store there is an interesting room. In this room are hundreds of bottles containing pills, chemicals, tinctures, fluid extracts and many other medicines that enter into the compounding of prescriptions. Here is also a delicate scale or balance and a very accurate set of weights. On a shelf nearby is an assortment of conical glass vessels called graduates ranging in capacity from 15 drops to one quart, all accurately graduated. On the wall is the proprietor's college diploma, earned after many years of intensive professional training, involving the study of Botany, Chemistry, Materia Medica, Physiology, Theory and Practice of Pharmacy, and other allied branches. Here in this room also are the official standard books, the British Pharmacopoeia and other books containing standards of recognized drugs, chemicals, and pharmaceutical preparations.

There must be no guesswork in this important room. The pharmacist's work concerns matters of life or death. The integrity of the man whose name has been inscribed on that diploma is at stake. Day by day frequently into the late hours of the night, this man, your pharmacist, is called upon to serve you as a professional man, to assist in the protection of you and of your loved ones. The little pills he makes require more skill than merely rolling them into spherical objects. All of the ingredients as prescribed by the physician must be carefully weighed on the delicate scale and the compounded so that the ingredients will be uniformly distributed. Every pill must be exactly like every other. Yes, indeed, there is much more to the fine art of the pharmacist than mere mixing. It is an art and a science, and one that requires many years of study and experience.

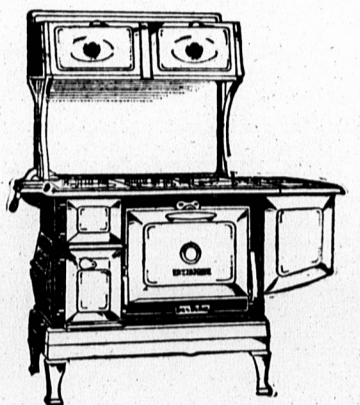

**Dies From Effects
Of Italian Gas**

DAVOS-PLATZ, SWITZERLAND, Oct. 16.—(AP)—Ras Nasibu died in a sanatorium today from the effects of Italian poison gas he choked down while leading Emperor

Halle Selassie's southern army against the Italian invaders of his country a year ago.

Physicians who attended him attributed the actual cause of his death to tuberculosis induced by the poison gas.

Nasibu was 42 years old, and loyal to the defeated Halle Selassie to the

end. The Emperor sent a letter to his faithful commander when he learned Ras Nasibu was dying, but it arrived too late.

Nasibu had been in the sanatorium three months all alone in his losing battle to regain the use of his scorched lungs.
