Sables Being Bred on Russian Farm

Flourish in Captivity for First Time, It is Said. On a State fur farm not far from Moscow, sables are being bred successfully for the first time...

The State farm covers 3,000 acres. Enclosures for sables extend over eighty acres and are similar to the animals' natural habitat as it is possible to have them. The sables now number several hundred. Also being bred on the farm are Canadian silver foxes, martens and mink.

North America is said to be the only place in the world outside of Russia where the sable is to be found.

"SCREAM BOMB" COUNTERED

LONDON, Nov. 7.—An anonymous inventor has drawn up plans for a "Bronx cheer" noise bomb as British and prize fight fans use to produce uncouth sounds. The inventor pointed out that small "pipe organ" tubes welded to the bomb fins by the Germans produce the terrific screaming noise intended to frighten the population of London when Nazi-raiders are overhead. In reprisal, he suggested the British should attach to their bombs "the rubber vibrators that small boys use to produce uncouth sounds." "The result," he added, "would be a 5,000-foot Bronx cheer, or 'Yasberry,' expressing all the way down Britain's very own contempt for the secret Nazi can do."

NO ALLOWANCE TO ITALIANS

OTTAWA, Nov. 7.—(CP)—Italian veterans of the last war who are still citizens of Italy no longer are entitled to the war veterans' allowance in Canada. Under an order-in-council tabled in the House of Commons today, payment of the allowance to nations of a country at war with Canada is prohibited.

MAY DETAIN ALIEN SEAMEN

OTTAWA, Nov. 7.—(CP)—Alien seamen who refuse to work on their ships when in Canadian ports may be detained for the duration of the war under an order-in-council tabled in the House of Commons today. The order is dated Sept. 12. It authorizes detention of such men in immigration stations, on order of the Minister of Mines and Resources, for the duration of the war, until the deportation of the seamen can be arranged or until they are willing to resume their duties with their ships.

GENERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

OTTAWA, Nov. 7.—(CP)—A general advisory committee on post-war problems is set up under an order-in-council tabled in the House of Commons today. The committee will consist of civil servants and representatives of several government departments under chairmanship of Brig.-Gen.

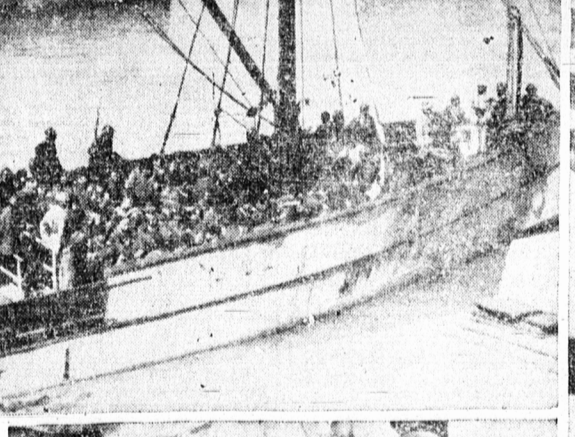
THOUSANDS OF CONVICTS
