LONDON, June 12—Organization of a co-operative body representing British manufacturers to stimulate sales and service in Canada is the main recommendation of the important trade mission sent to the Dominion recently by the Federation of British Industries.

...ing for firms, except those of great magnitude, to endeavor individually to sell their products in Canada. Co-operation of home producers is essential in order to build up a selling and service force in Canada to meet the pressure of competition from foreign countries.

The mission also makes important recommendations urging establishment of later communications and trade facilities between Canada and Great Britain, development of a policy of co-operation with existing Canadian manufacturing bodies instead of competition, and the organization of an Empire trade statistical bureau.

### TURKISH ARCHIVES SOLD AS WASTE PAPER

ISTANBUL, June 13.—(U.P.)—Archives dealing with hundreds of years of Turkey's history have been sold mistakenly as waste-paper.

For two years an official commission has laboriously been compiling, classifying and eliminating a huge mass of documents and papers dealing with the country's history.

Recently the Minister for Finance ordered that the most useless of this material should be sold. Due to some confusion, however, one hundred tons of documents classed as of the highest importance were carried off to Bulgaria by a Jewish buyer.

The government is endeavoring to recover them.

### ILLITERACY DECREASES AMONG ARIZONANS

PHOENIX, Ariz., June 13.—Illiteracy in Arizona has declined from 15.3 per cent. to 10.1 per cent. in the last ten years. C. O. Case, state superintendent of public instruction, has announced.

Arizona's record is remarkable and much better than the figures indicate, Case points out. A majority of those who cannot read or write are Indian wards whose education is under the direction of the Federal Government.

### Russian Govt. Announces Loan

HALF TO BEAR INTEREST; REST LOTTERY PRIVILEGES

MOSCOW, June 12.—The Government today announced the floating of a new internal loan of 1,600,000,000 rubles (about \$800,000,000) "For the purpose of completing 518 new factories in 1931, finishing 1040 tractor stations and fulfilling the five-year plan as a whole in four years."

It is called the "third and decisive year loan" and will be issued in two parts, one drawing 10 per cent and the other giving buyers lottery privileges in lieu of interest.

All the bonds are of 50 rubles denomination and probably will be distributed widely throughout the country. The Young Communists League of more than 2,000,000 members already has pledged to subscribe on the basis of at least one bond per member.

With last year's 1,120,000,000 rubles loan, the new issue brings the internal indebtedness to approximately 6,500,000,000 rubles. The new loan is in line with the Government's policy to issue no new currency in 1931.

### MADRID PLANS SKYSCRAPER

MADRID, June 12.—Madrid one of the few European cities to have a skyscraper, plans to build another one. A corporation was recently formed to erect a big theatre and office building. It would be 15 stories high, or two stories higher than the National Telephone Company's building.

### Speaking Of Sports

#### Pat Caraway Banks With Ace Pitchers

Cecil Pat Caraway, gangling Chicago White Sox southpaw, started his windup in American League ball parks last spring and they laughed at him.

But when he started to pitch, their snickers departed. They still laugh at "Cecil the Seed" but not when he's on the pitching mound. A year ago he was just a rookie with a crazy windup, but now he ranks as one of the foremost pitchers of the American League.

When Caraway winds up he seems to be tracing the design of a pretzel in the air. The motion is deceptive and confusing to batters.

"The most unusual pitcher I have ever seen," is Donie Bush's way of describing Caraway's pitching style.

From the start of the 1930 season Caraway has been one of the leading pitchers of the league. Recently over a stretch of four games he allowed only 17 hits, or an average of four and one quarter hits per game.

When Caraway was pitching for the Topeka Western League club in 1929, Dick Kinsella, scout for the New York Giants, looked him over and wired John J. McGraw:

"No fast ball. Won't do."

The White Sox bought him for \$6,500 and he has turned out to be one of the best investments made by that club in years. During the 1930 spring training season Caraway got home-sick and didn't want to stay with the club. He kept asking Bush per permission to go home for a few days. Bush finally asked him what he wanted to go home for.

"Well, I want to get my overcoat. It's going to be cold up north," Caraway replied.

Caraway calls his curve ball "a swerve ball."

One day Bush asked him if he was a good fungo hitter and he answered: "Not so good. I pitch wrong to myself."

He is six feet four inches in height and very slim, weighing about 175 pounds. He is 24 and lives in Gordon, Texas. In his first year in the majors he won 10 games and lost 10 and had an earned run average of 3.89.

**CLOVER BUILDS SOIL**

Dr. Frank T. Shutt, M.A., D.Sc., Chief of the Division of Chemistry Department of Agriculture, Ottawa is authority for the statement that one acre of a vigorous crop of clover, supplies the soil with 100 to 150 pounds of nitrogen, 30 to 35 pounds of phosphoric acid, and 85 to 115 pounds of potash. No wonder legume crops, such as clovers and vetches, are becoming increasingly popular as cover-crops with farmers throughout Canada.
