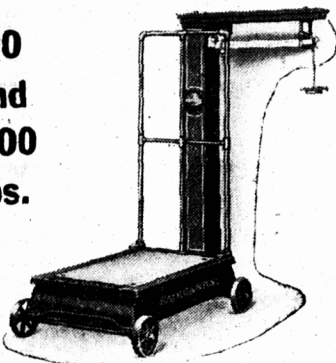

Mr. McLaren possessed to a remarkable degree the strong robust constitution peculiar to the old Scottish people, and was in his eighty-fifth year, when his work on earth was ended. A hard-working, and industrious farmer, he fulfilled to the letter the obligations of the "captain" of his man, being behind him a goodly inheritance. His funeral ceremony was conducted by the Rev. John Sterling, his earthly remains being laid to rest in the new cemetery at Montague, beside that of his wife, who predeceased him by eight months. Two sons, James and Sydney, both at home, mourn the loss of a kind and devoted father. He is also survived by a sister, Mrs. John Mellish, Union Road.

A pleasing feature of the evening was the address of Miss Wanda Wyatt on the part played by her sex at the Bar taking as a theme "Fortia" in Shakespeare's masterly play. The meeting broke up about midnight by all singing "For He's a Jolly Good Fellow." It was said by many speakers that this was the first function of the kind given in Summerside but they hoped it would not be the last as many appeared willing to accept invitations at once to other similar functions. Mr. J. O. Clare Campbell and Mrs. Campbell were up from Charlottetown, also Miss Avila Matheson, daughter of Chief Justice Matheson, graced the occasion with her presence.

—Mrs. Walter S. Burns of Saskatchewan, and Miss Lizzie Burns of Lower Freetown attended the Burns' Concert in Charlottetown. The efforts you so nobly put forth in our behalf. BERLIN, Feb. 1.—Signal lights to relieve Parliamentary congestion are being considered by the Reichstag. These signals would be yellow and red electric globes on each side of the Speaker's rostrum. Five minutes before an orator times up, the President of the Reichstag would switch on the yellow light, indicating to "cut it short". When the time had elapsed the red light would flash. Advocates of the innovation assert that Communists make such a racket nowadays that a deputy speaking often is unable to hear the President's bell.

Slower Landing Aviation's Problem

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—Nearly as much effort is now being directed by airplane inventors and producers to the job of making their machines go slow as has been devoted in the past to making them go fast.

Files of the Commerce department show lengthy exhibits on the subject with portrayals of devices which have been tested in actual service as well as those based exclusively upon theory.

Where the airplane operators most desire slowness in planes is at the moment of landing. The highly developed racing machines, with landing speed of nearly 90 miles an hour. The machines being adapted to commercial service land at a slower pace, but even so, the difficulties and annoyances from too great speed on the ground are numerous.

Birds met the same problem as airplanes in landing, but there isn't much for mechanical structures to take from their demonstration. The fast flying bird when alighting throws its body up against the air and kills almost instantaneously the last of its flying speed by a few powerful blows of its wings.

The airplane makers have had to turn to mechanics. One of the best of the devices thus far evolved to accomplish the purpose is being perfected by English constructors. In the so-called "slotted wing" construction, which permits the manipulation while landing of great but balanced wind resistance. Americans have been able to get some very good results with powerful automobile brakes, which have proved effectual in shortening the "run" of the plane.

One famous American designer, Grover C. Loening, has worked out a device to enable the entire wing of a machine to be tilted up at the moment of landing, producing strong resistance to further movement. The difficulty here is in developing wing strength to withstand the stresses thus applied, but out of the attempt has already come an accomplishment which the experts rate as valuable.

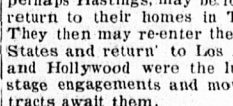

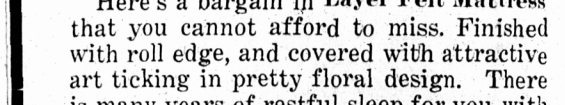
