CREDIT UNION LEAGUE—The organization of the Prince Edward Island Credit Union League will take place at Prince of Wales College Hall on Saturday, July 2. There will be morning and afternoon business sessions and a public meeting at night. A banquet will be held at six o'clock in the evening. R. P. Bergengren, managing director of the Credit Union National Association and one of the world's greatest authorities on credit unions, will be present at the meeting. A. B. MacDonald, managing director of the Nova Scotia Credit Union League and a member of the Extension Department of St. Francis Xavier University, will also attend. Word has been received that credit union members from various parts of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick are planning to come to the Island for this occasion. Since the organization of the New Brunswick Credit Union League is planned for June 30, in Moncton, a number of credit union delegates from St. John and Newcastle have sent word that they will come to Charlottetown for the Saturday meeting. There are now 35 credit unions in Prince Edward Island, with 3,000 members and assets approaching \$30,000. The Credit Union League is designed to federate these units and while it will not interfere with local ownership and control of the individual credit union it will give greater unity and purpose to the director of the movement as a whole.

CHURCH RE-OPENED — The morning service at St. John's Presbyterian Church, Belfast, was largely attended. The sermon was preached by the pastor, Rev. W. S. Wadland who spoke on "The Prodigal Son." This was the re-opening service as the church had been closed for some time as the interior was being painted. This splendid piece of work was done by Mr. E. Inglis and the church presents a very fine appearance today. Another interesting feature of the Sunday morning's service was the unveiling of a memorial window by Dr. Annie MacRae of Pinette which has been made possible by a bequest left to St. John's by her brother the late Roderick MacRae of Pinette, and Chicago. The new window is placed between the other two that were unveiled a short time ago and shows the Master standing with the Cup in His hand and the words, "In Remembrance of Me" written above. The coloring in each window is the same and casts a soft glow over the church. The window was unveiled during the singing of one of the hymns and immediately the sun poured into the church and brought back that old sweet story of "The Light of the World is Jesus." Other added auxiliaries to the church on Sunday were the two new flower stands placed on each side of the Communion table and were lovely with Spring flowers also a new Baptismal Font that contains the original silver bowl and this stands on the side. The choir seating has been re-arranged this being necessary as two doors have been cut on each side and now it is not necessary to go near the pulpit when passing from the church to the Church Hall. The soloist at the morning service was Mrs. A. Morrison who sang "The Lord's My Shepherd." At the evening service Mr. Herbert Worth was the soloist who sang "All Through the Night." The subject of the minister's discourse was "Heaven." That the number of visitors who are at St. John's weekly is very large is shown by the entries in the Visitors' book from time to time.

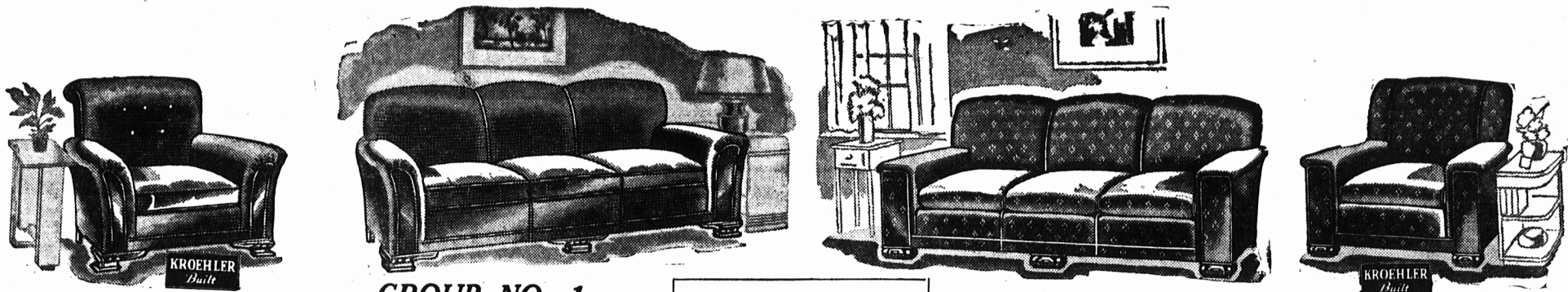

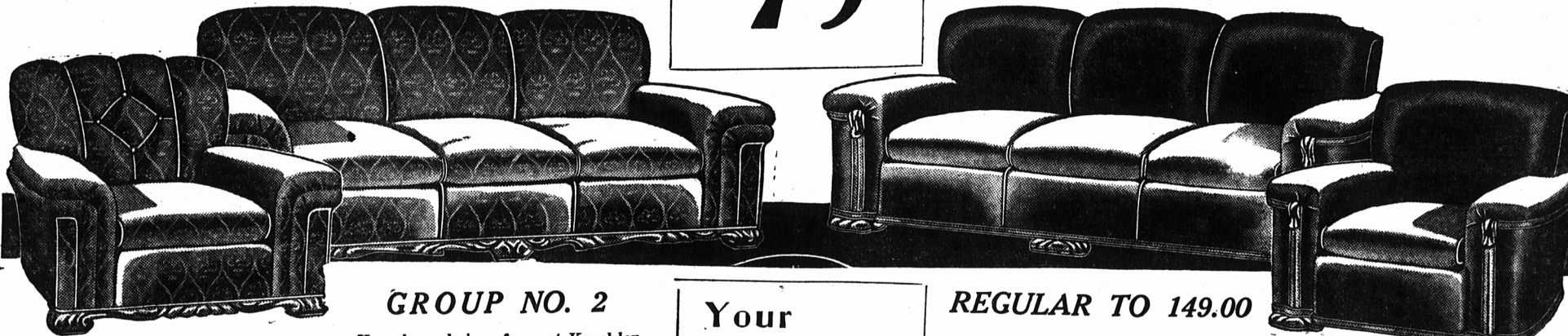
